PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Monday, Oct. 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Jesuit High School was closed today due to some electrical and flooding issues. This helped reduce traffic congestion.

I received an email expressing concerns about excessive water running from a garden hose in the 5300 block of Marimoore Way. There was no water running when I drove by. It may have been pool water being drained.

Tuesday, Oct. 26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored several intersections for stop-sign violations, but observed none.

Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 26-27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a report that the stadium lights had been left on at Jesuit High School. There was nobody available to whom to report the problem. I advised the resident to contact the school in the morning about the issue.

At 3 a.m., I responded to a 911 call on Haggin Grove Way. The resident confirmed that it had been a misdial.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Wednesday Day, Oct. 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

An elderly resident on Sherlock Way waved me down to report that she was locked out of her garage. I tried to open the broken lock, but failed. She contacted a contractor working on a nearby house, who said he was sure he could get it open.

I took a vehicle burglary report in the 800 block of Jacob Lane. The victim said she had left

her purse visible in her car when she went to walk on the levee. When she returned, her car window was broken and her purse was missing.

Thursday Day, Oct. 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored traffic on Crondall near Estates. I warned one driver for failing to make a complete stop at the stop sign.

I responded to an audible alarm off of Haggin Grove Way. It was canceled before I arrived.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Night, 7 p.m.-3 a.m., Oct. 29-30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was a group of about 25 girls in their tweens dressed in pajamas and costumes standing in the street near Estates and Cortlandt. They were trying to take a group selfie. I stopped to offer some assistance so they could all be in the picture together and be safe from roadway traffic. I used their cell phone to take some group photos. The girls were all very excited and grateful that a cop took a photo for them. For me, it was another reminder of how great it is to patrol your neighborhood.

Saturday, Oct. 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Monday, Nov. 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure. I spoke to several neighbors and answered general questions.

All three schools were in session. I monitored the usual heavy traffic both morning and afternoon.

I checked the park and river access points but observed no problems.

Tuesday, Nov. 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Yorkville. The housekeeper was there and the alarm company advised that the control panel was not functioning properly.

The rest of the shift was uneventful.

Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., Nov. 2-3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

It was a very slow night for vehicle and pedestrian traffic. I paid extra attention to access points into the neighborhood from the American River Parkway.

Wednesday Day, Nov. 3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Throughout the day I spoke to many neighbors who thanked me for my service.

Thursday Day, Nov. 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored traffic on Crondall near Estates. I cited one driver for failing to come to a complete stop at the stop sign and advised him of the speed limit.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Day, Nov. 5

Saturday, Nov. 6

I started my shift by patrolling the neighborhood while it was still dark. At 6:37 a.m., I observed a stop sign violation at Kingsford and American River Drive. I stopped the car and recognized the driver because I had cited him a few months back in the same area for a stop sign violation. The driver remembered me, as well. This time I issued a warning after he told me he was heading out to catch a flight.

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I spoke with several people and handed out stickers to children.

I had been alerted that there might be a protest today at Jesuit High School. I paid extra attention and monitored the front of the school, but all was quiet.

Del Dayo Elementary, Ashton Park and Jesuit High School were all busy with games. There were lots of vehicles parked on the streets.

Monday, Nov. 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Tuesday, Nov. 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Due to the weather, very few pedestrians and bicyclists were out. Vehicular traffic was moderate.

Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., Nov. 9-10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Things were quiet in the neighborhood.

IN AN EMERGENCY

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
