

Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Wednesday, Nov. 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I assisted patrol with the arrest of an adult female who assaulted two people near Arden Way and Fair Oaks Boulevard. She choked one random victim and then entered the house of an elderly couple and terrorized them. She was arrested on several felony charges and booked at the main jail.

I checked on Rio Americano High School and Del Dayo Elementary School as they were dismissing class, but observed no issues.

I contacted a transient who was being aggressive with patrons in the Whole Foods parking lot and had her leave the area.

Thursday Day, Nov. 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

School was not in session today, so traffic was lighter and I observed no traffic violations.

I was waved down by a member who lives on Cortlandt. She reported seeing a suspicious person on her Ring doorbell camera. He was looking in the front windows and quickly fled on foot towards Fair Oaks Boulevard after he saw the Ring device. The man had long brown hair in a ponytail. The member also noticed several boxes that had been delivered at another member's home across the street, so I quickly drove over and moved the packages to the back yard. I drove down Fair Oaks Boulevard to see if I could spot the suspect, but did not locate him.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Day, Nov. 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

School was not in session today. The shift was quiet.

Saturday, Nov. 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes

appeared secure.

The shift was quiet.

Saturday Night, Nov. 13-14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure. I emailed one homeowner to explain that I had relocated some packages that had been delivered so they were less visible from the street and reminded him that packages are easy targets for thieves.

I spoke to another homeowner about the WDDNA patrols. The shift was otherwise quiet.

Monday, Nov. 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I patrolled both schools at the beginning of my shift. Traffic was heavy, but I observed no problems.

Tuesday, Nov. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a member's email about a vehicle parked on Beard at Shelato. I contacted the driver and advised him to move the vehicle as soon as possible.

Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., Nov. 16-17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to an email from a member asking how to file a vacation watch request. I responded with information.

The weather was foggy and traffic was minimal. The shift was quiet

Thursday Day, Nov. 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm at a home on Arden Way. It turned out to be false.

While patrolling, I came upon a wrecked vehicle parked on the roadway near the Regency Circle river access point. I advised parking enforcement officers, who later issued a 72-hour notice.

I stopped four vehicles for violations and issued several citations.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Day, Nov. 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

The shift was quiet.

Saturday, Nov. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes

appeared secure.

It is important for homeowners requesting a vacation watch to report that someone will be house sitting or that the homeowners are returning early. It could be dangerous for officers to be surprised by unknown occupants in a home.

I stopped a driver on American River Drive at Wilhaggin for a stop sign violation. The elderly couple was apologetic and stated they were late for church. I released them with a warning.

I responded to a 911 hang-up call off Keane Drive. It turned out to be an accidental dial.

I responded to a resident who reported that a trailer with a boat on it that had been parked on the street for several months. I contacted the owner and advised them to move the trailer onto their driveway.

I observed a white truck parked in a no-parking zone on Harrington Way. The owner was working on a nearby home. I advised him that his vehicle could be cited, but said I would allow him to park there during his work today.

Jesuit had a game today and about 3,000 fans were expected. I patrolled the area and showed a presence. The surrounding streets were crowded with vehicles. A resident waved me down about a vehicle parked on Jacob Lane in front of a fire hydrant. I cited the vehicle.

Monday, Nov. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to an email from a member about a speeding car on his block.

I monitored the intersection at American River Drive and Saverien, but observed no violations.

Tuesday, Nov. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure. I noticed that several houses had packages delivered and newspapers arriving while the homeowners were away.

I responded to a burglar alarm on American River Drive. While checking for suspicious activity, I discovered an open sliding glass door. Deputies cleared the home, but found nothing out of the ordinary. The homeowner arrived and explained that they usually leave the back door unlocked. I advised him that doing so is not safe.

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

- 1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
