



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Nov. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 47 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to an email about a possible homeless encampment on Fair Oaks Boulevard near Cortlandt. I checked the area and found some debris indicating that someone may have been there, but no indication of an active camp.

I stopped a driver for failing to observe the stop sign at American River Drive and Estates. The vehicle had not been registered since 2021, so I cited the driver for both offenses.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Nov. 25-26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 37 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to an email regarding a suspicious driver possibly checking the neighborhood for packages. I checked the area but could not find a vehicle fitting the description.

I observed many young people out driving around early in the evening, possibly due to it being a holiday weekend.

I responded to Ashton Drive about a report of a home being "egged" by some juveniles in a vehicle. Around the same time, there was a call regarding two vehicles throwing eggs at each other. One of them matched the description from the other "egging" call.

I contacted the homeowners at the house that was egged. They said there was no damage, everything was washed up and told me that their teenage son may have known the youngsters who threw the eggs. I followed up on the report by contacting a woman at a home that may have been associated with one of the egging vehicles. She said her teenage daughter was driving around Rio Americano High School with her friends and their vehicles had been egged recently. I advised her of the ongoing "egg war" and she said she would speak to her daughter about it and discipline her appropriately.

I responded to a report that man appeared to be trying to enter a side door at a home on Marimoore Way. I located the subject and determined that no entry had been made into the home, so I cited the man and took a report.

Saturday 4 p.m.-10 p.m.

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

During my patrol, I noticed that many homes had packages left on their front porches. I wish to remind everyone during this holiday season that there are a great many porch pirates around. I encourage everyone to find a trusted neighbor to keep your packages safe while you are away from the home, even for short periods of time.

There were lots of vehicles out tonight, but everyone seemed to be obeying the rules of the road. Everything was secure at the schools and the river access points.

I stopped and spoke to a family setting up Christmas decorations on McClaren Drive. I gave stickers to the children and let them sit in my patrol car and turn on the lights.

I received an email during my shift about teenagers riding motorcycles on the levees during the day causing a ruckus and unsafe conditions. I forwarded the email to Park Rangers who patrol the area.

Sunday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Nov. 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 36 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a residential alarm. The home seemed secure, but I was not able to get into the backyard. I called the phone number we had for the home and left messages. About an hour later the residents returned home, called me back and said things were fine.

I helped one gentleman from out of town who had trouble finding an address. He followed me to the house.

The park had very light traffic today and very few people, except for dog walkers.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Nov. 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

All parks and river access points were free of homeless individuals. It was a very quiet shift.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Nov. 29-30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I received an email about a broken-down car on Thornley Way north of American River Drive. A man had been seen riding a bicycle up to the car, putting gas in the tank, opening the hood, then leaving. I checked the area for the car, but it was gone.

All the river access points were clear of cars and people. The park was quiet.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Dec. 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I issued a warning to a driver who had rolled through the stop sign at Wycombe Drive and Estates.

It rained most of the day and the neighborhood was quiet.

Friday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Dec. 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored traffic around the schools, but observed no traffic or parking violations.

It was a quiet shift.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Dec. 2-3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to two panic alarms, both of which both were false.

There was a basketball game at Rio Americano High School. It ended around 10:30 p.m. and lots of kids were driving around the neighborhood. However, I didn't observe any problems.

I responded to a report of a missing 72-year-old man who refereed a basketball game at Jesuit High School, but never made it home. I found the man's vehicle in the Jesuit parking lot and learned that he was talking to a coach inside the gym for four hours with his phone off.

I cruised Ashton Drive where there had been reports of houses being egged recently. All was quiet.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Dec. 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

At one of my checks, I called and emailed a resident regarding a package on the front porch. I was unable to hide it.

All parks and river access points checked clear.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Dec. 6-7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 13 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I attended the WDDNA annual meeting and spoke with some homeowners who had questions after the meeting.

At 10:25 p.m. I responded to an email about a man with a beard near Keane and Jacob. I located the man, who was walking eastbound on Keane. He said he was heading to his uncle's house and I was able to validate that.

All parks and river access points checked clear tonight.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Dec. 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

During the morning commute a school bus was stopped on American River Drive near Jacob Lane with its red lights flashing. All the opposing traffic failed to stop as required by law. So, I stopped one of the drivers to educate him on the rules when encountering a school bus with flashing red lights.

I cited a driver who failed to stop at the stop sign at Wycombe and Estates. I issued warnings to drivers who rolled through stop signs at Kingsford and Arden and at Kingsford and American River Drive.

Thursday-Friday, 4 p.m.-midnight, Dec. 7-8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 12 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I issued a warning to a driver who failed to stop at the sign at Arden Way and Haggin Grove Way.

Saturday-Sunday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Dec. 10-11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 10 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to an email reporting a suspicious vehicle seen on Keane Drive Nov. 24. A security video showed the vehicle driving the wrong way with its hazard signals on. I told the homeowner that I stopped a similar car doing the same thing on Keane recently and determined that it was a water district inspector looking for irrigation violations .

It was very rainy tonight, so I monitored several intersections along American River Drive, Jacob Lane and Ashton to make sure people were driving safely.

IN AN EMERGENCY

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
