PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Thursday Midnight-6 a.m., March 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked schools and all the river access points. There was no activity.

The shift was quiet and uneventful.

Thursday Day, March 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I assisted patrol with a panic alarm on American River Drive and an incomplete 911 call on Arden Way. Both were determined to be false or accidental.

I stopped a vehicle that had no front license plate. The driver checked clear and I advised him to install a plate.

I assisted patrol looking for a wanted subject near El Camino High School. Patrol units quickly located the subject hiding in a drainage canal near the school.

Friday Day, March 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored several intersections for traffic violators, but observed none.

The shift was otherwise quiet.

Friday Night, March 12-13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to an email about a suspicious motorcycle parked in front of a vacant home. I arrived at the location within two minutes, but the motorcycle was gone.

I stopped a group of teens riding bikes and skateboards down the middle of American River Drive after midnight. The group was very cooperative, so I counseled and released them.

I checked all river accesses points several times, but observed no activity.

I monitored stop signs on American River Drive, but observed no vehicle violations.

Saturday, March 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There were a lot of people out for school events and garage sales and enjoying the nice weather. I visited some garage sales to say hello. Because there was a lot of traffic out today, I stayed highly visible and

watched for traffic violations, but observed none.

The Sheriff's Academy was running training scenarios and firing blanks. As a result, there was a mistaken report of shots fired at William Pond Park. I contacted the complainant, who was not from the area, and advised her and other park goers about the activity at the academy.

Saturday-Sunday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., March 13-14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked all the levee access points, the schools and Ashton Park. There was a new email regarding a suspicious motorcycle. I checked the area but was unable to locate the bike. I replied to the email and updated the member on the situation.

Monday, March 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

It was a cold and cloudy morning and not many people or vehicles were out.

Tuesday, March 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure. Several residences had newspapers in their driveways. It is important to pause deliveries while you are away so newspapers do not stack up and signal that you are not home.

I monitored intersections for traffic violations, but observed none.

I responded to a report of loud music being played at a home on Saverien Drive, but I heard nothing when I checked.

Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., March 16-17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a report of an apparent abandoned vehicle, but it had been removed when I arrived.

I responded to a report of people parking vehicles and entering William Pond Park after hours, but all vehicles and people were gone when I checked the area.

I checked all schools and river access points. There was no activity at the river. I contacted a truck parked at the elementary school with two individuals inside. I advised them to leave, which they did.

Wednesday Day, March 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to the 900 block of Saverein Drive on a noise complaint and mediated between two neighbors.

I went off the clock for about 45 minutes to respond to a report from the Mission Oaks Recreation and Parks District about a problem at Mission North Park on Mission Avenue. When I arrived, I encountered an argumentative transient who had taken up residence in the public restroom. He initially refused to provide his identity, saying that the county owes him compensation for stealing his property. So, I asked him for his name and address so they could send him a check and he gave me his name and date of birth. A records check revealed that he had an outstanding felony warrant, so I placed him under arrest and booked him at the Main Jail.

Thursday Midnight-6 a.m., March 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked the schools and all the river access points. All were quiet.

Thursday Day, March 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was a report of loud music playing on Saverien Drive. Patrol was close and handled the call. The residents were contacted and the music was turned down.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Day, March 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

As I was leaving the neighborhood, I encountered a traffic accident on Fair Oaks Boulevard near Marconi Avenue involving two vehicles. It appeared that the first vehicle had been traveling at a high rate of speed and could not stop in time to avoid hitting the second vehicle that was stopped in traffic. The driver of the stopped vehicle was transported to an area hospital.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Night, March 19-20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I contacted four youngsters behind Rio Americano High School. They were skating and confirmed that they had been drinking. I contacted their parents, who arrived and picked them up.

I stopped a black Charger that rolled through a stop sign. Both occupants were on probation for burglary-related charges. I searched their vehicle and found some items indicative of burglary but nothing linking the two men to a crime. I photographed the items and forwarded the images to property crimes detectives.

Saturday, March 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm, which appeared to be false.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Saturday-Sunday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., March 20-21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked the levee access points, the park and schools.

It was a very quiet night.

Monday, March 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Rio Americano High School had some in-person instruction underway, so traffic was heavier today. I patrolled American River drive to make sure no vehicles were speeding or running stop signs.

Tuesday, March 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All but one home appeared secure. I found one home with an unlocked side door. The garage door into the house was also unlocked. I checked the interior of the home and it appeared secure, so I locked the doors and left.

I was dispatched to Fair Oaks Boulevard and Wilhaggin Drive regarding a parked vehicle. I contacted the owner, who said the vehicle was disabled. It had been parked there for three days, so I advised him that he needed to move it immediately or it would be towed. I checked back several hours later and it was gone.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Wilhaggin Drive. I checked the residence and it was secure.

I responded to a report of an unoccupied vehicle parked on Crondall in front of an empty field. The vehicle was legally parked and registered. I answered an email from a member about the vehicle.

Wednesday Day, March 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure. I found an unlocked door at one location, but it did not give access to the house, which was secure. I advised the homeowner of the situation.

I monitored traffic at Del Dayo Elementary School for both arrivals and departure times, but it was very light.

I assisted patrol deputies responding to a report of a single shot being fired in a business complex at the intersection of Fair Oaks Boulevard and Watt Avenue. We determined that the noise was caused by an electrical transformer that blew out.

I was waved down by a resident who wished to turn in an old BB gun, BBs and some live ammunition she had found while cleaning out her home. I collected the items and booked them for destruction.

Otherwise, it was a quiet shift.
