



PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Thursday Day, Dec. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks.

While conducting a vacation check at a house on Regency Circle, I noticed that the garage door was open. I learned that a neighbor had opened it to unlock the gate for landscapers and it had malfunctioned when it was closed. It had automatically re-opened, but the neighbor did not realize it. I checked the garage and everything appeared okay, but I could not determine if anything had been stolen. I closed the door but was unable to contact the homeowners, who were out of town and not answering their phone.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Saturday, Dec. 26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm on American River Drive. It had been caused by a resident's error and checked clear.

I responded to Rio Americano High School when a silent alarm was activated in the large gym. I found the school football coach playing basketball with other unidentified individuals and had them all leave.

Saturday-Sunday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., Dec. 26-27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked Rio Americano High School, Ashton Park and all river access points. I monitored major intersections for traffic violations and cited a driver for running the stop sign at American River Drive and Saverien.

I assisted the K9 Unit following a report of shots fired in the vicinity of American River Drive and Watt Avenue. We were unable to locate anything of concern.

Monday, Dec. 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and was able to complete nearly all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I patrolled all of the river accesses and Ashton Park.

Wednesday Day, Dec. 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I received an email and photo of a person going through trash cans. I drove through the neighborhood but did not see the subject.

I observed a vehicle parked near Gary Way in an area marked for permit parking only. Because it did not

have a permit, I issued a citation.

Thursday Midnight-6 a.m., Dec. 31

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked both schools and all river access points, but observed no concerning activity in the areas.

Thursday Day, Dec. 31

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Near Arden Way and Gary, I encountered an unpermitted vehicle parked on a street reserved for resident parking. I cited the vehicle.

I stopped and warned a driver for a traffic violation.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Night, Jan. 1-2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a report of a suspect vehicle at Estates and American River Drive. It was gone when I got there.

Saturday, Jan. 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I observed a vehicle with no license plates heading eastbound on American River Drive toward Morris Way. I stopped the vehicle and determined that the driver was unlicensed and the vehicle did not have a valid registration. I cited the driver and had the vehicle towed.

The rest of my shift was quiet.

saturday-Sunday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 2-3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked Rio Americano High School, Ashton Park and the levee access points. It was a quiet night.

Monday, Jan. 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was an email from a member who reported seeing a street sweeper driver talking on his cell phone while operating the sweeper. I checked the area, but could not locate the sweeper.

I responded to an incomplete 911 phone call. The resident said it was a misdial.

Tuesday, Jan. 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Pedestrian and vehicular traffic was moderate. Bicycle traffic was light.

Wednesday Day, Jan. 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to an alarm call in the 4800 block of Keane Drive. It was false.

I was called to the 5400 block of Bentley Way to assist with a medical incident. A woman had some physical injuries and Metro Fire transported her to a hospital.

It was an otherwise quiet shift.

Thursday Midnight-6 a.m., Jan. 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked both schools and all the river access points. The shift was quiet and uneventful.

Friday Day, Jan. 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored traffic at the Kingsford/Arden Way stop sign and Kingsford/American River Drive stop sign. I observed no violations while I was there.

I was waved down by a resident who said his neighbor was chasing his dog that had gotten loose. I responded to help, but the dog had been recovered.

A resident stopped me at Kingsford and American River Drive to inform me that a small homeless camp was getting started at the UPS store near Arden Way and Fair Oaks Boulevard. I contacted the camper, advised him to move along and referred him to the Sheriff's Department Homeless Outreach Team.

Friday Night, Jan. 8-9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a late-night house fire in the 800 block of Wixford Way. Metro Fire cleared the scene quickly.

I encountered an unattended vehicle with an expired registration parked in the Rio Americano High School parking lot. I cited it.

A couple of hours later, I encountered another car parked in the Rio lot. The occupant was a 19-year-old resident whose car was full of packaged alcoholic beverages. He said he was waiting there to meet some friends. He was sober and said all the alcohol belonged to his parents and he was just holding it for them. I told him that was nice of him, but that he needed to dump it all out right now. I watched him pour about \$75 worth of beer and liquor onto the ground. Several cars approached as this was happening, but just kept going. When he had finished disposing of the alcohol, I released him and he left the school.

I responded to an alarm call in the 400 block of Watt Avenue. It was false.

Late in the evening, I came upon vehicle at the dead-end of Battlewood and Thistlewood. The young couple inside said they were "just talking." After I confirmed that they had no wants or warrants and were adults, I instructed them to go elsewhere to talk.

It was quiet otherwise.

Saturday, Jan. 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I assisted a stranded motorist who needed a tow and stood by for traffic control.

I was contacted by a resident inquiring about someone selling a motorcycle who did not have current paperwork. I checked the license plate given by the seller. It revealed that the motorcycle had been stolen out of Placer County.

Saturday-Sunday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 9-10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked the schools and Ashton Park for subjects loitering, but observed none.

I monitored the major intersections for vehicle code violations and stopped a driver for running a red light. The driver appeared intoxicated, so I turned the case over to CHP to conduct a DUI investigation. The driver was intoxicated, but tested to be just under the legal limit, so he was released.

Otherwise, it was a quiet night.
