## **PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS**

**Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order**

### **Armed robbery at 5 Points Center**

An elderly man was robbed at gunpoint Monday afternoon, March 21, outside the Bella Bru café in the 5 Points Shopping Center at Fair Oaks Boulevard and Arden Way.

The crime took place at about 2:20 p.m. in the parking lot. Three men dressed in hoodies accosted the victim, pointed a handgun at him and demanded his watch. As soon as they got the watch, they fled the scene in a silver four-door sedan.

Investigators reportedly do not believe it was a random crime. According to the Sheriff's Department crime report, the victim had recently left a local jewelry store prior to coming to 5 Points and investigators believe he had been followed from that store by the robbers. The getaway car was a rental and was later recovered.

Several witnesses saw the incident and provided information to the deputies at the scene. If you have any information to provide about the crime, you may contact the Sheriff's Department non-emergency number at (916) 874-5115.

### **Friday Day, March 11**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 30 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 4000 block of Dunster Way. The exterior and interior of the home checked clear. It appeared to be a false alarm.

I received an email from a resident in the 5500 block of Susan Way regarding a pouch she found in her front yard. Upon inspecting it, I found what appeared to be methamphetamine inside. I booked the pouch and its contents for destruction.

I monitored traffic around Rio Americano High School, but observed no violations.

### **Saturday, March 12**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was dispatched to a silent alarm in the 1000 block of River Walk Way. It was a false alarm.

**Sunday, March 13**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was waved down by a Bella Bru customer who reported seeing a man sleeping at the west end of the parking lot. I contacted the subject, who was asleep in his sleeping bag. I advised him that he was on private property and needed to leave, which he did. I threw the trash he left behind into the dumpster.

I checked the rear of the 5 Points Shopping Center and found a woman who appeared homeless. When I contacted her, she appeared to be fascinated by a collection of balloons that she was trying to pull out of the dumpster. She reluctantly left the parking lot when I advised her to do so, but she headed southbound on Arden Way toward the residential area. So, I contacted her again and advised her to leave the entire area. She complied.

**Monday, March 14**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored traffic around schools, but observed no violations. It was a quiet shift.

**Tuesday, March 15**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Gary Way. The homeowner's son had accidentally set off the alarm while he was checking on his father. The son told me that his father had fallen and was bleeding. I determined that the man needed emergency medical treatment, so I requested an ambulance and waited until it arrived.

I responded to an email about a black Prius that was frequently parked near Offham Court. I was unable to locate the vehicle.

**Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., March 15-16**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I spoke with a homeowner on Gordon Lane about how to position a security camera to make it more effective in capturing suspicious activity.

There were no issues at Rio Americano High School or the river access points.

**Wednesday Day, March 16**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A resident emailed me about a car blocking the wheelchair access on Saverien Drive. I located the vehicle and cited it.

I responded to Kingsford Drive where an elderly resident thought someone may have attempted to burglarize her home. I determined that the problem was that she had manually locked her garage door, then tried to open it with her remote control, damaging the locking mechanism and making it appear that it had been pried.

**Thursday Day, March 17**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked around Rio Americano High School but observed no parking violations.

I monitored traffic at Wilhaggin and Sydling and stopped two vehicles that failed to come to complete stops at the stop sign. I issued a warning to one of the drivers. I cited the other for not having proof of insurance.

### **Friday Day, March 18**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure, except for one, which had an unlocked side garage door. I alerted to the local contact about it.

Traffic was light throughout the neighborhood today. The rest of the shift was quiet.

### **Friday Night, 7 p.m.-3 a.m., March 18-19**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points but observed no problems.

I chased several carloads of juveniles out of the Rio Americano High School parking lot late at night.

I responded to a report of a transient asleep in the bushes at Del Dayo and Day Drive. I located him and had him leave the area.

I responded to a report of numerous people gathering in a parking lot at Arden Way and Fair Oaks Boulevard. When I arrived, there were about 25 cars parked in a row, but no one was around. I believe they may have parked there to attend a party at an apartment complex across the street.

I responded to a report of a bonfire at Wilhaggin and Crondall. It turned out to be on the other side of the river.

It was a quiet evening otherwise.

### **Saturday, March 19**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Crondall Drive. There was no answer at the door and the home appeared to be secure.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

### **Saturday Night, March 19-20**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There were no issues at Rio Americano High School. All the river access points were clear.

I responded to a report of someone screaming in a back yard on Morris Way. I determined that it was a child who had screamed, but everything was OK.

**Sunday, March 20**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Del Dayo. The exterior was secure. I saw that a light was on in a back bedroom, but no one was there and no one answered the door. All appeared okay.

**Monday, March 21**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of a bomb threat at Rio Americano High School. I contacted the janitors and determined that the report was frivolous.

I checked the park and river access points. All areas checked clear.

**Tuesday, March 22**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Pedestrian and bicycle traffic were light. Vehicle traffic was moderate.

**Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., March 22-23**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

At 10 p.m. I instructed four carloads of juveniles to leave the Rio Americano High School parking lot.

All river access points were clear of cars. The rest of the shift was quiet.

**Thursday Day, March 24**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped and cited a 16-year-old driver for running the stop sign at Crondall and Estates.

I monitored traffic at Wilhaggin and Sydling and issued a warning to one driver who failed to come to a complete stop at the stop sign.

I assisted patrol near Fair Oaks Boulevard and Jacob in response to a report by a woman who believed that someone had entered her home. We determined that it was the woman's granddaughter who had not told her that she was would be coming home.

**IN AN EMERGENCY**

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

**TO REPORT A CRIME**

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
