

Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies



PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Saturday-Sunday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., April 10-11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked Rio Americano High School, Ashton Park and the levee access points and there was no activity of any concern.

I responded to a report of a party with kids in the street in the 800 block of Morris. I located the house and observed multiple kids out front. They said the owner of the house had ended the party because too many people had shown up. The kids ordered Ubers and went home after cleaning up the mess in the road.

Monday, April 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was an extremely nice day out. There were lots of people out and about. I responded to several emails and questions from people on the street seeking information on a number of topics.

Tuesday, April 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I spoke with several residents and answered numerous questions.

Bicycle and vehicular traffic were light.

Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., April 13-14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the schools and all river access points. I contacted two occupants in a vehicle parked at Rio Americano High School and had them leave.

The shift was otherwise quiet.

Wednesday Day, April 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of an abandoned airstream trailer in the 700 block of Regency. It turned out to be registered at that residence and was hitched to a pickup truck. The owner said the truck had broken down and that the rig would be moved within three days.

I responded to an alarm in the 3800 block of Crondall. It checked clear. The owner had left the back door unlocked.

I responded to a panic alarm at Selby Ranch. It was false.

I responded to a report of an unknown male wandering around the Jesuit High School campus. He was gone when I arrived, but the reporting party had written down his license number, so we will know who he is if he returns.

Thursday Midnight-6 a.m., April 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the schools and all the river access points. The schools were secure and there was no activity around the access points.

I responded to an alarm on Crondall Drive. It turned out to be false.

Thursday Day, April 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Jesuit High School reported that some drivers were using Gordon Lane in an attempt to gain access to the school instead of using the main entrance on Fair Oaks Boulevard. The school asked that we monitor Gordon Lane during pickup times. I checked Gordon Lane, but observed no vehicles while I was parked there.

The rest of the shift was uneventful.

Friday Day, April 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a 911 hang-up call. It turned out to be a misdial.

I monitored Del Dayo Elementary School for drop-off and pick-up. Multiple parents thanked me for being there and advised me that there have been many traffic and safety issues in the short time school has been back in session.

I also monitored the stop sign at Wilhaggin and American River Drive during the afternoon rush hour.

I stopped a white jeep on Ashton for equipment violations. The vehicle had previously been seen driving up and down multiple neighborhood streets. The subject checked clear and said he was looking for his brother who was working on a house under renovation in the area. I released him with a warning about the equipment violations.

Friday Night, April 16-17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of a suspicious woman in the 600 block of Mystic Lane. She was gone when I arrived.

It was a quiet night otherwise.

Saturday, April 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A resident asked me to check on a man who had parked a motorcycle on Keane Drive and walked down the street. I contacted the subject, who said he was in the area to attend a garage sale, but had motorcycle trouble. The subject and the motorcycle checked clear.

The rest of the shift was uneventful.

Saturday-Sunday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., April 17-18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored the parks, schools and levee access points for illegal activity. I monitored major intersections for traffic violations. It was a quiet night.

Monday, April 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored vehicle traffic around Del Dayo Elementary School. It was very congested, but there was

nothing I could do to improve traffic flow.

I monitored the dismissal traffic at Rio Americano High School, but observed no problems. They are still attending half days.

I responded to a report of an April 16 porch package theft in the 4000 block of Ramel Way. The theft was discovered when the homeowner reviewed video surveillance. I included an image of the suspect in the report.

I responded to an incomplete 911 call in the 3400 block of American River Drive. It turned out to be a misdial.

I responded to an alarm in the 1100 block of Jacob Lane. The master bedroom door sensor had activated, but the home and all its doors checked secure.

Tuesday, April 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure. At several of the homes, I found packages that had been delivered to porches. Where possible, I moved them out of sight.

It is important that homeowners who are planning a trip arrange to have their packages held or picked up by friends to avoid package theft and to prevent home burglaries.

When I checked one home on American River Drive, I noted that the homeowners' boat was missing. I contacted them and learned that the boat had been picked up for service by a boat company.

Many people were out walking dogs. There were very few cyclists. Traffic has increased since schools reopened, but I observed no traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., April 20-21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I contacted two people in a vehicle parked at the river access point on Jacob Lane. Both checked clear and I advised them to move on.

I contacted several people at Ashton Park and advised them of park hours and loitering ordinances. They all left the area.

I stopped a man riding a bike without a light on McClaren Drive. He checked clear and I advised him to get a light for his bike.

The remainder of the shift was uneventful.

Wednesday Day, April 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored Rio Americano High School, Jesuit High School and Del Dayo Elementary in the morning and afternoon hours for vehicle code violations. Traffic was moderate and slow.

I checked all four river access points multiple times. All checked clear.

I observed a silver Ford Crown Victoria – an old unmarked law enforcement vehicle – parked in the Lyon Real Estate lot. The trunk was open and there were at least two bags on the ground. I contacted a man who said he was homeless and living in the vehicle. Because it had a current registration and there had been no complaints about the subject, I left the area. As I was ending my shift, I saw the vehicle leaving the area.

I stopped two vehicles for equipment violations and gave verbal warnings to the drivers. One vehicle had a missing front plate; the other had a dark tinted front windshield.

Thursday Day, April 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I assisted patrol on Crondall Drive with a subject experiencing a health problem.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Day, April 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. Nearly all of the homes were secure. At one home, I found two unlocked exterior doors. I contacted the homeowner and secured the doors.

I stopped and cited a driver for failing to stop at the stop sign at American River Drive and Jacob Lane.

The rest of the shift was uneventful.

Friday Night, April 23-24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all river access points throughout the night. All were quiet.

Traffic was very light. I monitored several intersections and observed no traffic violations.

Saturday, April 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I assisted patrol responding to a resident off American River Drive who reported that a vehicle across from her home had a loud muffler. I discussed the situation with the her.

Residents on Sand Bar Circle were holding a block sale, so I drove the street several times to show a law enforcement presence and prevent any potential theft.

A local resident was giving his daughter driving lessons in a parking lot off American River Drive. The car hit a tree in a median on the lot and ended up with two flat tires. There were no injuries. I was unable to contact the property owner, so I provided the resident with the phone number.

I was waived down on American River Drive across from Jesuit High School by a resident who reported that several vehicles on the street had their tires slashed last night. No one had yet filed a formal report on the incident.
