## PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

### Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

#### **Monday, April 26**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked all the river access points and Ashton Park several times. All was quiet.

#### **Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., April 27-28**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked the schools and the river access points and observed no issues.

#### **Wednesday Day, April 28**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I was waved down by a resident on Ashton Place Drive about a vehicle burglary that occurred overnight. The victim has video of a male suspect entering his vehicle parked in the driveway around 1:30 a.m. Nothing was taken. A neighbor's vehicle across the street was also entered. I took an "attempt burglary" report.

I responded to a report of a female transient who was asleep on the sidewalk on Arden Way near Fair Oaks Blvd. After waking her up, I determined she was not under the influence, not a mental health candidate and did not appear to have any significant medical issues. I transported her to Loaves & Fishes for some assistance.

It was quiet otherwise.

#### **Thursday Day, April 29**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I stopped a vehicle that was traveling approximately 60 mph on Fair Oaks Boulevard. The driver was a 17-year-old Jesuit High School student who could not tell me how fast he had been going, indicating to me that he was not paying attention. I cited him for speeding.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

#### **Friday Day, April 30**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure, with one exception. I found that a garage door had been left open at one home. A neighbor told me it had been open all day. I secured the garage and sent an email to the homeowner.

Multiple callers reported a man chasing and yelling at customers in the Bella Bru parking lot. I responded

and observed the subject breaking a rear windshield wiper on a parked vehicle. I detained him and identified him as a transient. He was under the influence of narcotics, was behaving erratically and was a danger to himself and others. I was able to contact the owner of the damaged vehicle, who lived in the Wilhaggin area, and told him what happened. I arrested the subject for vandalism and disorderly conduct and booked him at the Main Jail.

I responded to a complaint from a resident about an ongoing noise issue involving a neighbor whose car has a loud muffler. I went to the home in question, but the vehicle was not there and I was unable to talk with the owner of the car. I advised the complainant that by law an exhaust cannot be louder than 95 decibels. I also noted that the CHP would have the primary authority to inspect and test the vehicle for a possible violation.

### **Friday Night, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., April 30-May 1**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I chased several juveniles from Rio Americano High School late in the evening. I checked all the river access points several times, but they were empty. It was a quiet evening.

### **Monday, May 3**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I assisted patrol responding to a burglar alarm on in the 1200 block of Los Rios Drive. The alarm company stated that a male was on site, but did not have the code. We checked the home and found it to be secure.

I assisted patrol responding to a report of a family disturbance in the 4800 block of Oak Vista Drive. We spoke with the family and advised them of their options.

I monitored traffic on American River Drive when Rio and Del Dayo released their students. Traffic was very heavy and congested for a short time.

### **Tuesday, May 4**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a 911 hang-up call on Dorking Court. It appeared to be accidental.

Pedestrian and bicycle traffic were light. Vehicular traffic was significant on the smaller streets, but I observed no violations.

### **Tuesday-Wednesday 10 p.m.-4 a.m., May 4-5**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

All river access points were quiet.

I encountered several people in Ashton Park after hours. I advised them of park hours and they all left.

I encountered several people at Rio Americano High School. They all left when I approached them.

I came across two subjects walking over the levee into the business complex on American River Drive. One was on a bike and the other was beside a vehicle. I asked them for their identification and what they were doing on the property after hours. One of the subjects refused to provide any identification. After a brief scuffle, I took him into custody. The security officer for the business complex then arrived and issued a Notice of Trespass to the other subject. I transported the first subject to jail, where he was booked for resisting and obstructing a peace officer's duties. The second subject was released.

The remainder of the shift was quiet.

### **Wednesday Day, May 5**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I was waved down by a Wyndgate resident who had questions about our new body-worn cameras.

I assisted patrol with a 911 hang-up call. The residents had accidentally dialed 911 instead of 916.

I was waved down by residents walking near Jacob and Marlborough who stated that vehicles often ran stop signs or were seen speeding when Rio Americano High School students were released. I monitored the intersections at Saverien and Ashton. Although I observed no serious violations, I could tell that my presence may have had an effect.

I checked all the river access points and all seemed quiet.

### **Thursday Midnight-6 a.m., May 6**

Soon after beginning my shift I was called to cover for general patrol in the North Patrol Division because the regular units were dealing with a homicide case.

Prior to that, I was able to check several of the homes on the vacation watch list. All those I checked were secure.

### **Thursday Day, May 6**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

The rest of the shift was uneventful.

### **Friday Day, May 7**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. Nearly all homes appeared secure. At one home, I located an unsecured sliding glass door. There were no signs of forced entry and there was nothing suspicious. I attempted to contact the resident and the local contact with negative results. I left voicemails for both of them.

As students were driving away from Rio Americano High School after dismissal, I stopped one of the drivers and issued a warning because he had unsafely passed on the right shoulder.

I assisted patrol responding to a report of a suspicious subject on the Rio Americano High School campus. I contacted the subject on Saverien Drive and determined that he was a former student. We issued a notice of trespass and sent him on his way.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

### **Friday Night, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., May 7-8**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked all river access points and monitored traffic at several intersections.

It was a very quiet night.

### **Saturday-Sunday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., May 8-9**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

At Rio Americano High School I observed a car driving recklessly and drifting through the parking lot. Multiple people and cars were in the area. I stopped the driver and cited him for the reckless driving.

I responded to an incomplete 911 call in Wyndgate, but was unable to locate anything suspicious.

I monitored the levee access points and major intersections throughout the shift.

### **Monday, May 10**

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked the river access points, but observed no problems.
