



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

## PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

### **Wednesday 4-10 p.m., May 10**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored the intersection at American River Drive and Saverien Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

I responded to an email request from a neighbor who wanted to make sure his house was still on the vacation watch list.

I stopped a suspicious vehicle on American River Drive occupied by three people. The driver and front-seat passenger were on probation for theft-related offenses. The passenger in the rear seat was on parole with a lengthy criminal history. They said they were coming from an unknown address on Shelato. Their stories were inconsistent when asked why they were here and where they were going. Their criminal histories and assortment of tools in the vehicle suggested a possible plan to burglarize homes. A search of their vehicle yielded no evidence of criminal activity. I identified each of them, ran them for warrants, contacted the owner of the vehicle and released them with the understanding that they were returning to Marysville.

### **Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 11**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I observed a vehicle on Estates Drive roll through the stop sign at Wycombe Drive. I stopped the driver and gave a verbal warning to make a complete stop at the stop signs.

I observed and cited a vehicle parked on American River Drive in the "no stopping/parking" zone near Whitehall Drive.

A WDDNA member near Jacob Lane and Kipling Drive emailed that they were confronted by a motorcycle rider after they saw the motorcyclist riding recklessly. The motorcyclist threatened to come back to the member's house at a later time. The motorcycle was a black and orange sport bike and the rider was a male in his 20s dressed all in black. A records check of the vehicle revealed that the registered owner lives in the neighborhood. The WDDNA member told me that they would be filing an online report about the incident.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

**Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., May 13**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 36 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I patrolled the river access areas and assisted park rangers with a woman who had gotten her credit card stuck in a pay machine. The card was successfully removed.

I received an email regarding an ongoing parking issue. I forwarded the complaint to the Sheriff's parking enforcement officer assigned to our area.

The rest of the shift was quiet

**Saturday, 4-10 p.m., May 13**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored Jacob and Keane Drive intersections, but did not observe any traffic violations.

The river access points were quiet. I passed out Sheriff stickers to several kids playing in the neighborhood.

**Sunday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 14**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was heavy vehicle and pedestrian traffic throughout Wilhaggin all day long. I monitored several intersections, but did not notice any traffic violations that warranted a vehicle stop or citation.

I responded to three calls for service near the Wilhaggin area. One involved a report of a transient threatening people with a large knife on the American River Bike Trail between Ashton Drive and Estates Drive. I checked the area with rangers, but was unable to locate the subject. The other two cases also involved transients near the intersection of Fair Oaks Boulevard and Arden Way. I contacted both subjects and sent them on their way.

**Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 15**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked on the parks and river access points. All were quiet.

I also monitored the intersection at Estates and Wycombe Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

**Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., May 16-17**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a complaint about loud music coming from a home near Wilhaggin and American River Drive. I responded within one minute. Although I did not hear loud music, I spoke with the residents and advised them to be mindful not to disturb others with loud music. I also spoke with the complainants to hear their concerns and offer possible solutions.

I checked all the river access points and all were clear.

I spent some time patrolling south of American River Drive to deter any potential gas thieves.

**Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 17**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 30 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I cited a driver on Baytree Drive for a registration violation.

I stopped and advised a driver near Eastern and Fair Oaks Boulevard for having a partially covered license plate.

I responded to a report that someone in a parked vehicle might be trying to set up a camp in front of a house in the 900 block of Los Molinos. By the time I arrived, the neighbors had chased the vehicle away.

I was dispatched to a report of a fight involving several adults at Rio Americano High School. It turned out that a student's mother was upset that her daughter was being harassed by some other students and she wanted to confront them in person. The principal and I calmed her down and explained the rules for parents visiting the school.

I drove past a male transient with a bicycle standing in front of a home in the 4900 block of Fair Oaks Boulevard. By the time I could turn around, I had lost sight of him. I checked the exterior yard of the home, but never located him.

**Wednesday 4-10 p.m., May 17**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored several intersections, but observed no problems.

Overall, it was a quiet night.

**Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 18**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Around 9 a.m. I observed two vehicles parked at Ashton Park with several young males who appeared to be 16 to 20 years old. They got into their vehicles and headed toward Rio Americano High School. I followed one of the vehicles – a silver BMW with no license plates. It turned into Rio and I initiated a traffic stop. The driver was a 20-year-old male who claimed to be a student. I cited him for the license plate violation. The principal later informed me that the vehicle was the same one that had been seen driving recklessly on and off campus.

I stopped and issued a warning to a driver I observed roll through the stop sign at Estates Drive and Wycombe Drive.

I assisted patrol with an incomplete 911 call at Jesuit High School. The call was determined to be a misdial.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

**Friday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 19**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 34 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I patrolled the river access areas and Ashton Park. All was quiet. I monitored traffic, but observed no violations.

**Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., May 19-20**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was a broken water main that opened up a hole in the road on American River Drive near Morris. CHP responded for traffic control and the county put cones out to warn drivers until the pipe is fixed.

Rio Americano High School had an event for the seniors in the evening, but the campus was cleared out by 10 p.m. Overall it was an extremely quiet night.

**Sunday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 21**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was heavy vehicle and pedestrian traffic today.

I responded to an emailed report of a suspicious vehicle parked at North River and Bank Court. The vehicle checked clear, however it had no plates. I issued a citation for the violation and referred the vehicle to parking enforcement for follow up.

I responded to a report of a suicidal person on American River Drive at Watt Avenue. I contacted the man and determined that he was not suicidal, just upset because of issues with a new phone that wasn't working. I provided him with options and sent him on his way.

I monitored traffic at several locations, but observed no traffic violations that warranted a citation.

I helped park rangers locate a person on the American River Parkway who reported that he had been bitten on the leg by a rattle snake. The subject was transported to UCDMC by ambulance.

**Monday 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., May 22**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I assisted patrol dealing with a homeless person hanging out under a tree near the front of Rio Americano High School while students were on campus. I convinced patrol to give the subject a ride out of the neighborhood.

I responded to a report of an incomplete 911 call. It turned out to be a misdial.

I monitored traffic at Jacob Lane at Keane, but observed no stop sign violations.

I monitored traffic on Wilhaggin Drive and cited two drivers for running the stop sign.

All the river access points were quiet.

**Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 23**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

A resident waved me down on Jacob Lane and expressed concerns about teenagers she

had heard "drifting" in intersections near her home. She also said she had seen drivers failing to stop at stop signs and nearly striking pedestrians. I told her about the Wilhaggin Del Dayo Neighborhood Association patrols and services of which she was unaware.

I monitored the four-way-stop at Ashton and American River Drive and at Saverien and American River Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

I monitored traffic at Jacob and Keane Drive and stopped a woman driver who rolled through the stop sign. She spoke a foreign language with very little English. A records check showed that her license, vehicle registration and insurance documents were valid. I issued a verbal warning.

#### **Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., May 23-24**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to Jacob Lane where a homeowner reported having problems with local teenagers who have been driving by and yelling profanities. The homeowner said he believed the youths may also have been involved in toilet-papering his home.

Around 9:30 p.m. I was near American River Drive and Wyndgate when I heard seven gunshots nearby. It sounded like they were coming from the river or from La Riviera Drive. I checked the surrounding areas, but did not find any evidence of shooting. Multiple callers also called 911 to report the shooting, but no one could pinpoint exactly where it came from.

At 1:30 a.m. I responded to a report of a woman sitting in a black truck on Exmoor Circle who may have been going through trash cans to collect recyclables. When I contacted the woman, she said she did not have any recyclables in her truck and denied going through trash cans. She said she was lost and trying to get to Rancho Cordova. I did not believe her because she had a working phone with GPS. I determined that she had no outstanding warrants then advised her that going through trash cans to collect recyclables is not allowed. I provided her directions to Rancho Cordova and followed her to make sure she left the area in the proper directions.

#### **Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 24**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I received an e-mail from a resident in the 4500 block of Fair Oaks Boulevard about a homeless camp right outside his driveway. I went to the location and located a female transient sitting among eight garbage bags full of recyclable cans. She said she was gathering recyclables all night and was waiting to get picked up by her boyfriend. I told her she needed to leave; she said okay and started hauling off her garbage bags eastbound on Fair Oaks Boulevard. She said she was heading to the AM-PM at Fair Oaks and Marconi. I contacted the reporting resident that, if all the bags were not removed, I would have the county come by and pick them up.

I checked all the river access points.

A case of felony vandalism at Rio Americano High School was reported to the Sheriff's Department. Unknown perpetrators destroyed a lot of school property and defaced the walls with pornography.

## ***HOW TO CALL FOR HELP***

### **IN AN EMERGENCY**

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

### **TO REPORT A CRIME**

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
