



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Wednesday 4-10 p.m., May 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored several intersections and stopped and issued a warning to one driver for rolling slowly through a stop sign.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I stopped and issued a verbal warning to a driver who rolled through the Ashton Drive stop sign.

I was waved down about a homeless subject in the street on Fair Oaks Boulevard near Jacob. The transient was gone when I arrived and I was unable to locate him.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 37 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I patrolled the river access areas and parks, but observed no problems.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday-Saturday, 5 p.m.-1 a.m., May 26-27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 40 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I spoke at length with a Sierra Oaks Neighborhood Association resident, who reported a number of home burglaries in recent months.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Sunday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 41 listed vacation checks. All homes

appeared secure.

I noted an email from a member who suffered a bruise from a water balloon thrown by teenagers from a passing vehicle on American River Drive yesterday. I contacted the member at home and discussed the incident.

I checked all the river access points and they were all clear of any suspicious vehicles or subjects.

Ashton Park was busy with birthdays and Memorial Day family events. Otherwise, the neighborhood was very quiet with very little traffic.

Monday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., May 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was no school today. I checked all the river access points, which were busy due to the holiday and beautiful weather. I observed no issues.

I monitored traffic at Jacob and Kipling for about an hour. During that period, I stopped and cited two drivers for running the stop signs.

I monitored the intersection at Saverien and Ashton and stopped and cited one driver for running the stop sign.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

All the river access points checked clear of any suspicious vehicles or subjects.

I monitored traffic at Estates and American River Drive, but observed no violations.

At Saverien and Ashton Drive I stopped and issued a verbal warning to one driver for rolling through the stop sign.

At American River Drive and Ashton, I saw a driver turn north on Ashton without stopping. He then proceeded on the wrong side of the street towards Ashton Park, where he turned into the curb before stopping. I contacted the driver, who was 17 years old, and cited him for several vehicle code violations.

Immediately after completing that citation, I saw another vehicle do a "California Stop" at the stop sign at Oak Vista and Ashton. The driver acknowledged his error and apologized. I issued a verbal warning.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., May 30-31

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked all the river access points for problems. There were none.

The night was cold and very peaceful. Because of recent burglaries in the Sierra Oaks area, I paid extra attention to suspicious trucks traveling along American River Drive and Fair Oaks Boulevard.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 31

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation checks. All homes

appeared secure.

As I was checking a home on Piccadilly Circle, I noticed the back gate was standing open and there was a vehicle parked in front with an out-of-area license plate. There was no information about the vehicle in the vacation watch listing. I went into the backyard and observed a woman cleaning pool equipment. She told me she is the sister of one the homeowners and that she periodically comes over while they are away to tend to the yard and swimming pool.

I assisted park rangers with the felony warrant arrest of a transient on Shelfield Way.

A citizen reported a transient sleeping on American River Drive under the Watt Avenue bridge, but I was unable to locate him.

Wednesday 4-10 p.m., May 31

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored traffic at several intersections, but observed no violations.

It was a quiet night.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I observed a vehicle on American River Drive near Jacob that appeared to have no license plates. As I got closer, I noticed there was a temporary license affixed to the rear of the vehicle and it checked clear.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., June 3

Although no deputy was available to patrol for WDDNA today, one of our deputies noted that an on-duty patrol unit today responded to the 500 block of Grovsnor Court following a report of an assault in which a resident of the home was punched by a visiting boyfriend. The young man was arrested and his car was towed.

Sunday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I followed up on an old email regarding two transients setting up in the area of Saverien Drive and Arden Way. I determined that no homeless camp had popped up.

I responded to an email about two transients riding their bikes through the area of American River Drive and Jacob Lane. I was unable to locate them.

I monitored traffic at several locations, but observed no violations.

While at the intersection of American River Drive and Kingsford Way, I received a report from a resident about a reckless driver. I checked the area but was unable to locate the vehicle.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., June 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I received an email concerning a noise coming from a home on Exmoor Drive, but the resident cancelled the complaint when the noise stopped.

I monitored traffic at American River Drive and Ashton, but observed no violations.

All the river access points checked clear of any suspicious activity.

I stopped and issued a warning to a driver who rolled through the stop at Wilhaggin and American River Drive.

After Rio Americano High School let out, I stopped and issued a verbal warning to an adult driver who rolled through the stop sign at Saverien and Ashton.

I responded to a member on Exmoor Circle complaining of a high-pitched noise coming from inside a home on Wilhaggin Drive. I made several attempts to contact the residents of the house in question, but nobody was home and I was unable to obtain a phone number for the owners.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., June 6-7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a homeowner on Kipling Drive who was having concerns about barking dogs disturbing the peace. I met with the homeowners and listened to their concerns. I explained that such situations are best handled by communicating with the dog owners. As an alternative, a homeowner can call 311 to file a complaint with Animal Control.

I responded to the park access off of Harrington Way where two vehicles were locked behind the gate after hours. I let them out and advised them that the gates are locked at dusk.

I noticed an older Acura parked in a no-parking zone near the river access at Estates and Crondall. The driver was alone in the car. He had no active warrants outstanding, so I told him to move along, which he did.

It was a peaceful night. Some people were out late walking their dogs.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I noted that a residential burglary was reported May 26 on Kipling Drive. A woman had forcibly entered the rear of the home in the middle of the night, but nothing was reported missing.

I responded to a report of a transient on Lantern Court, but he was gone when I got there.

I encountered another transient on Lake Wilhaggin Drive who appeared to be preparing to jump into the man-made lake. He told me that he wanted to clean up. I told him to go somewhere else to do so. He checked clear and I had him move on.

I responded to a 911 hang-up call on Sandbar Circle. It turned out to be a misdial.

I was waved down by a resident near American River Drive and Thornley Way about a backpack lying in the bushes on a neighbor's property. I looked through the backpack and determined that it contained electronics that likely belong to a transient. I tried to contact

the resident on whose property the backpack was found, but nobody was home. I told the reporting party that I could not remove the backpack from private property without the consent of the homeowner.

Otherwise, it was a quiet day.

Wednesday 4-10 p.m., June 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored traffic at several intersections, but observed no violations.

I parked at Rio Americano High School, Del Dayo Elementary School and Ashton Park to provide some high visibility security.

I checked river access points, but observed nothing of concern.

I responded to a report of a transient in the area of Fair Oaks Boulevard and Wilhaggin. I was unable to locate the subject, who was last seen on a bike heading toward Watt Avenue.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 38 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I contacted a homeless woman who was cleaning up her camp near Fair Oaks Boulevard and Wilhaggin Drive. A records check on her came back clear. After she cleaned up her camp, she left the area.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 41 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked all the river access areas and Ashton Park, but observed no problems.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., June 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 37 listed vacation checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a report of a home burglary in the 4800 block of Keane Drive. The front door had been kicked open last night. I assisted two patrol deputies who also responded.

The home had tags on the door left by UPS about an attempt to deliver a package. There were no cars in the driveway and there was little exterior lighting – all things making the home an attractive target for burglars. The home did not appear to be lived in. I contacted the daughter of the owner to advise her of the burglary.

Closets, cabinets and doors were open as if someone was searching for valuables. The front door appeared to be the only point of entry. Patrol deputies took a report and we secured the house. I contacted the neighbor who had reported the incident.

I received an email from a member reporting that someone had rung his doorbell just after midnight and immediately walked away. I replied to the email and left a voicemail.

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.

If you see someone engaged in suspicious activity but it is not an emergency, call 916-874-5115 (Sheriff's Department non-emergency line).
