PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Monday, July 12

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a 911 hang-up call in the 700 block of Morris Way. The homeowner was home and said the call was accidental.

Thursday Day, July 15

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Day, July 16

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I issued a warning to a driver who failed to stop for the sign at American River Drive and Ashton Drive.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Saturday, July 17

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed many of the listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I dealt with a traffic accident that blocked Fair Oaks Boulevard until CHP arrived.

I spoke with a homeowner on Sand Bar Circle who reported that someone had flung something over her fence into her pool. The item had come over the fence from the yard of the vacant home behind hers. I spoke with neighbors and both property owners and determined that it was likely a prank by local young people.

Monday, July 19

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I assisted Park Rangers with a homeless female who had a small cooking fire burning in the Harrington River access parking lot. Park Rangers cited her.

While on that call, I observed a small fire in a trash can. I used a fire extinguisher on it until Metro Fire responded and extinguished it.

Tuesday, July 20

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared

secure.

I answered several emails from residents and responded to a 911 hang-up call, which turned out to be a dialing mistake.

Thursday Day, July 22

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I assisted a patrol unit responding to a report of a vehicle whose driver appeared to be casing the neighborhood. We contacted the subject and determined that he was just waiting for his wife who was house cleaning.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday Day, July 23

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I monitored the stop sign at Wilhaggin and American River Drive, but observed no major violations.

Friday Night, 7 p.m.-3 a.m., July 23-24

I patrolled the entire neighborhood and completed all listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

For a Friday evening, it was very quiet. I checked the river access points and found that they were empty.

I encountered a car parked in the Rio Americano High School parking lot and had the driver leave.

At 2:30 a.m., I came upon two people sitting in a car parked in the 900 block of San Ramon Way. They turned out to be a local young couple having a relationship discussion. I told them to talk somewhere else.

If you see someone engaged in suspicious activity but it is not an emergency, call 916-874-5115 (Sheriff's Department non-emergency line). To avoid the recorded message, dial 0 after the line is answered.
