PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Just a Reminder

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 11-12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

Around 9:30 p.m. I responded to a 911 hang up call in the 4100 block of American River Drive. I was able to speak with the resident and determined that it was an accidental misdial.

All was quiet at the high schools, the park and the river access points. There was very little foot traffic and vehicle traffic tonight.

I followed one car that turned off his lights as he crossed Fair Oaks Boulevard onto Gordon Lane. I followed the car to make sure it was not going to cause issues, since I am aware that this court has had its share of unwanted vehicle traffic. The driver turned out to be a homeowner's son returning home.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 37 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I drove by the schools and checked for parking violations, but found none.

I stopped and cited a driver who ran the stop sign at Saverien and Ashton drives.

The rest of the shift was uneventful.

Friday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 40 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

It was a quiet shift.

Sunday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 listed vacation watch checks. Nearly all homes appeared secure. At one home I found an unlocked gate and discovered a latch out of order at a gate leading to the pool. I left a message for the homeowner and secured the gate as I left. The property otherwise appeared secure.

It was much cooler and several residents were out walking dogs.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Oct. 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There were no calls for service today. All the parks and river access points checked clear. I monitored the intersection at American River and Kingsford drives, but did not observe any traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 18-19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

About 12:30 a.m. I spoke to a man walking around the neighborhood near Gary and Meredith. He said he lives in the neighborhood and likes to get out and walk at night to take a break from being a programmer staring at computer screens all day.

At 12:45 a.m. I responded to an alarm at a home on Wilhaggin Drive. I knew this house was on the vacation watch list and no one was home. So, I requested another deputy to assist with checking the property. We checked the backyard and exterior of the home. All entry doors were secure and there was nothing suspicious. While we were talking in the driveway at 1:20 a.m., the audible alarm went off again. I left a message on the homeowners' phone and emailed them that they may need an alarm system inspection.

All the river access points were quiet and I observed no other problems anywhere during the night. Vehicle traffic was light and no one was walking around.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I drove by the schools but observed no parking violations.

I spotted a vehicle traveling near Jacob Lane and Marlborough Way without a front license plate. I turned around and eventually located the vehicle parked on Marlborough Way near Sherlock Way. I saw that the front window was down and the left rear "wing" window was broken out. The vehicle also had no rear license plate. I asked a few people on the street if they had seen who was driving the vehicle, but they had not. I ran the vehicle identification number through DMV and it checked clear. Then a worker who was unloading a delivery truck approached me and said he owned the vehicle. I advised him

that he needed license plates.

I checked Ashton Park and noticed several vehicles that had been parked there for an extended amount of time. The vehicles checked clear.

The rest of the shift was quiet.

Friday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to an audible burglar alarm in the 4300 block of Dorking Court. It proved to be false.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 21-22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I saw a suspicious vehicle parked along American River Drive near Kingsford. The driver checked clear and said he had just finished fishing and was using his phone. I sent him on his way with no incident.

At approximately 7:45 p.m. I spotted a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed and swerving in both lanes near Ashton Drive and American River Drive. I attempted a vehicle stop, but the vehicle fled. I pursued it as it blew through several stop signs, all the while speeding without its headlights on. The driver ultimately crashed into a light pole and fire hydrant on American River Drive between Jacob Lane and Harrington Way. Fortunately, no other vehicles or pedestrians were hit. All of the airbags in the vehicle were deployed and the driver attempted to walk away from the scene, but I detained him. CHP arrived on scene and conducted field sobriety tests, then arrested the driver for evading a police officer and driving under the influence.

Sunday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I received an email about a suspicious occupied vehicle. I looked for it, but was unable to locate the vehicle and was unable to contact the member who emailed about it because that person did not provide any contact information.

Otherwise it was a quiet shift.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Oct. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I patrolled the river access points and Ashton Park, but observed no problems.

I monitored several stop signs around the neighborhood. Aside from a few hard stops by motorists who must have seen me at the last minute, I observed no traffic issues.

HOW TO CALL FOR HELP

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.

SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY (Not an emergency)

If you see someone engaged in suspicious activity but it is not an emergency, call 916-874-5115 (Sheriff's Department non-emergency line).
