



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Thursday 8 a.m.-2 p.m., Dec. 26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 42 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There were several people outside walking their dogs. The rest of the shift was quiet.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Dec. 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 17 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A homeowner in the 4200 block of American River Drive reported unknown people approaching their home while they were away on two separate occasions. I checked the perimeter and found the home secure. I left a message via their ring doorbell to report my finding.

I was waved down by an individual asking me to sign off on a "fix-it" ticket, which I did.

I spoke to an adult who appeared to be smoking marijuana at Ashton Park. I advised him to leave the park and he did so without further incident.

I reviewed a complaint about an SUV seen speeding on Keane Drive. The vehicle sounded like one I was familiar with on a court off of Keane. I drove by, but did not see a vehicle matching the description.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Dec. 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 40 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed an email about an incident in the 5200 block of Shelato Way in which gas had been syphoned out of a vehicle.

I checked all parks and river access points on multiple occasions, but did not observe any problems.

I monitored the American River Drive intersections at Saverien and Harrington, but observed no traffic violations. Traffic was pretty light.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Dec. 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 38 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Today was a clear and chilly day. Schools are out for the winter break, so traffic was light. All parks and river access points checked clear.

I monitored the intersection at Wilhaggin and American River Drive, but observed no traffic

violations.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I assisted patrol and the fire department in checking on the welfare of a resident near American River Drive and Whitehall. We knocked on the door, but there was no answer.

I took a grand theft report from a homeowner off Brompton Court. The suspect(s) entered through an unlocked gate on New Year's Eve night and stole a gray electric GenZ bike from the side yard. Only the electric bike was taken, not the two standard bikes.

I checked around the schools and the river access points, but observed no issues.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Jan. 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 30 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was waved down by a man walking his dog on Regency Circle. He was concerned that a neighbor had not closed her garage door. I was able to make contact with the neighbor, who was grateful that her neighbors were looking out for her.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Elsdon Circle. The alarm company said that there were two back door slider activations. The company said the homeowner was not home. I arrived on scene and checked the home and back yard, but saw no signs of trespassing or burglary.

I checked the parks and river access points. All were clear of problems.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Jan. 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and the parks multiple times, but saw nothing of concern.

I monitored the American River Drive intersections at Saverien and Harrington, but observed no traffic violations.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Jan. 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a member who asked that a deputy stand by during an upcoming an eviction.

Students were still out of school, so it was very quiet. All parks and river accesses were clear of any problems.

I monitored multiple intersections, but didn't observe any traffic violations.

Tuesday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Jan. 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report that the front door of a home in the 4200 block of North River Way was standing wide open and the homeowner's dogs were running around outside. I checked the interior of the house and determined that no one was there. I drove back a few hours later and found the resident back home. He said he had left in a hurry and had forgotten to lock his doors. The dogs returned on their own.

A homeowner in the 800 block of Robin Lane had requested that a deputy be on site to ensure that there would be no trouble during an eviction. The homeowner said his tenant

had gotten into a serious argument with his wife and wanted to be sure there would be no trouble when the tenant returned to pick up the last of her property. The homeowner left before the tenant arrived. The tenant gathered the last of her property and left without incident.

I drove all the streets and checked river access points and the schools. I observed no issues.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 7-8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I heard fireworks around midnight, but it sounded like it was coming from across the river.

I checked the parks and river access points and monitored several intersections for traffic violators but observed no issues.

I monitored a female transient I saw near Fair Oaks Boulevard and Gordon Lane to make sure that she didn't enter the neighborhood. She seemed as if she was a either high or had mental health concerns. She eventually left the area.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was patrolling Kipling Drive when I saw a parked vehicle without any license plates. A records check revealed that the vehicle was registered. I cited the vehicle for having no plates.

While patrolling, I was waved down by a resident who found a lost wallet. I took custody of the wallet and booked it for safe keeping, pending retrieval by the owner.

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
