



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Friday-Saturday, Midnight-4 a.m., Jan. 10-11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Traffic was minimal, but I contacted one transient individual on Arden Way near the William Pond park access. He had no criminal history. I advised him of park hours and he left the neighborhood on foot.

All river access points, schools and parks checked clear.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Jan. 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was a request to pick up an abandoned bicycle, which I did.

I contacted a group of individuals who appeared to be loitering in the Ashton Park parking lot. They got in their cars and moved on.

I monitored a home on Keane Drive that had been posted for security checks due to the power being shut off for non-payment. I saw nobody on the property.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Jan. 11

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Jan. 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed an email from a member whose daughter's vehicle was cited for not having license plates. The vehicle had been previously stolen and spent the past six months in the shop getting repaired. I responded and signed off the fix-it ticket.

I monitored intersections on American River Drive at Saverien Drive and Harrington Way, but observed no traffic violations.

The river access points and parks all checked clear.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Jan. 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

School has resumed, so traffic was heavy in the morning. There were lots of people out walking their dogs.

I monitored the intersection at American River Drive and Ashton Drive, but observed no

traffic violations.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 300 block of Wyndgate Road. The front door sensor had been activated. I contacted the homeowner who said that the alarm was accidental and everything was okay.

I checked on the parks and river accesses. All were clear of any problems.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Jan. 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I received an email from a member on Haggin Grove Way requesting to meet with a deputy to get recommendations for security camera placements they wish to install around the exterior of their home. We walked the perimeter and identified the most vulnerable access points. I provided suggestions for security camera placements and future alarm sensors.

I stopped by a Keane Drive home identified as a nuisance house. The Problem Oriented Policing team was present to enforce a move-out order. The occupants were packed up and leaving.

I assisted Park Ranger and CHP units at a major three-vehicle accident with injuries at Arden Way and Fair Oaks Boulevard. One person was transported to the hospital.

All river access points and Ashton Park checked clear.

Traffic was heavy towards the end of the afternoon. I monitored several intersections throughout the shift, but observed no violations.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was waved down by a county road maintenance crew supervisor near Fair Oaks Boulevard and Day Drive. He had found a loaded handgun in the bushes adjacent to the roadway. It was rusty and had not been reported as stolen. I took possession of it and booked it as found property.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped a vehicle driving in the bike lane near American River Drive and Wilhaggin Drive. The driver had a suspended license. I issued a citation for the violations and had someone pick up the driver.

I checked the schools and river access points, but observed no issues.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 17-18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 of the scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Traffic was busier than last week. I pulled over one driver near American River Drive and Jacob Lane for driving without his headlights on. He lives in the neighborhood, was on his way home and had forgotten to turn the lights on. I issued a warning.

Later during the night, I contacted a man sitting near the entrance to Wyndgate. He checked clear, lives in Selby Ranch and said he was just waiting for a friend. I suggested that he move along and wait near his home, which he did.

All river access points, schools and parks checked clear

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Jan. 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was an email asking for a welfare check on an elderly resident on Crondall Drive. No one answered the door at the home and the email did not supply enough information to warrant further action.

The park and schools were busy, but quiet.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Jan. 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Traffic was heavy in the neighborhood, but I observed no problems.

Sunday, 2-10 p.m., Jan. 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I assisted patrol checking a vacant house on Keane Drive for possible trespassers. We found nothing suspicious.

There were several people out walking around the neighborhood in groups, enjoying the brisk weather.

I contacted a person who seemed lost and was wandering around on American River Drive near Wilhaggin Drive. I gave him directions to a destination out of the neighborhood.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Jan. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on all river accesses and parks. I spoke with a park ranger who was patrolling the parkway looking for people who had dogs off leash. He noted that a coyote had recently attacked a dog that was off leash. I saw him cite one person.

Vehicle traffic was very light and there were lots of people out walking and cycling.

I monitored the intersection at American River Drive and Estates, but saw no traffic violations.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Jan. 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all river access points and the schools, but observed no issues.

Mid-morning, I responded immediately to Rio Americano High School in response to an anonymous internet post threatening to shoot up the school in the next few minutes. I arrived, along with several patrol units, but the threat turned out to be unfounded. There were no issues there all day.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 21-22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Tonight, the temperature was 34 degrees, so I saw no one out walking. I made sure to check the known nuisance spots, including the parks and river access points, as well as the home on Keane Drive.

I drove around with my front spot lights on to let any problem individuals know that the neighborhood was being patrolled by law enforcement and that I was looking for them.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I drove all the streets, monitored traffic flow, checked river accesses and checked all schools in the area.

I patrolled Keane Drive several times, but saw nothing suspicious.

There were lots of delivery vehicles delivering packages; I trailed a few but saw no porch pirates. It was a quiet day.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

All streets around the schools and river access points were clear of any issues.

I monitored several stop signs, but did not see any traffic violations.

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
