



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Jan. 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I spent some time speaking to a group of girls and a Girl Scout troupe leader regarding safety when approaching doors and strangers to solicit cookie sales.

There were several people out and about walking dogs. I spoke to three whose pets were off leash about the county ordinance and safety. All were receptive.

I addressed an individual who parked his car in an unsafe manner in order to access the parkway. He re-parked without further concern.

There were no dispatched calls for service during my shift and I finished by driving through the neighborhoods and spoke to a few other residents.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Jan. 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a neighbor regarding ongoing mental issues with a neighbor in the 4200 block of North River Way. I provided some information regarding the situation and how to best handle it.

Both Rio Americano High School and Jesuit High School had sporting events today. I didn't observe any traffic problems.

I monitored multiple intersections and didn't observe any traffic violations.

I conducted a welfare check at a home in the 4600 block of American River Drive. The call stated an exchange student was having issues with her guardians. We mediated the situation and provided both parties with options.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park multiple times, but saw nothing of concern.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Jan. 12-13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

While reviewing previous logs and emails, I noticed an ongoing mental health issue with a female resident in the 4200 block of North River Way. During my shift, I paid extra attention to the area and drove by multiple times. The woman in question generated one

call for service – an incomplete 911 call – which stated "I'm not calling 911." The woman did not answer a return phone call and did not answer the door when I arrived.

Tuesday 7a.m. to 3 p.m., Jan. 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I stopped and gave a verbal warning to a driver for failing to come to a complete stop at Kingsford and American River Drive.

I received an email from a WDDNA member with a photo and video of a reckless driver. The sender stated that the driver had committed the same violation on prior occasions. The member's phone video showed the car making a turning violation from Estates onto East bound Fair Oaks Boulevard. I determined that the license plate was registered to a local resident, so there is a good chance this driver is taking the same route each morning. I responded to the sender and explained that I must catch the driver in the act in order to issue a citation. I offered some additional options.

I walked through Ashton Park several times where families were enjoying the playground. A Mission Oaks employee was painting over some graffiti that vandals had sprayed onto the tennis courts over the holidays.

I monitored traffic at Saverien and Ashton. Because drivers saw my vehicle, there were no stop sign violators.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 13-14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I assisted patrol responding to a report of a possible burglary at an apartment in Selby Ranch. A drunk man had been kicked out of a girlfriend's apartment and was seen trying to open the door of another apartment and urinating on the front patio. Once the incident settled down, I resumed my patrol.

I read a series of emails about a woman residing on North River Way who has mental problems and whose actions have caused concerns for her neighbors. I made sure to drive by tonight.

The parks and river access points were free of any concerns.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked river access points and the three schools. I saw no problems.

I responded to a domestic violence report involving a car parked at Fair Oaks Boulevard and Eastern Avenue. The occupants were boyfriend/girlfriend who were arguing, but I saw no evidence of physical violence. After calming down, one of the occupants decided to walk home; the other drove off.

I responded to a report of a theft at the Walgreens at Eastern and Arden Way. Three teenagers had stolen \$1,100 worth of merchandise. The thieves were gone when I arrived. Because no patrol units were available, I took the grand theft report.

I monitored traffic at several American River Drive intersections, but observed no violations.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I stopped and gave a verbal warning to a driver who had stopped just past the limit line at Crondall Drive and Estates.

I stopped and cited another driver who was traveling 56 mph in a 40 mph zone on Fair Oaks Boulevard near Saverien. When I paced the driver, he apparently had no idea I was behind him. He didn't seem to see my emergency lights until I activated my siren.

I stopped and cited a driver who rolled through the stop sign at Estates and Wycombe. The driver had been stopped before and cited for the same thing over a year ago.

Friday, 5 p.m.- 12 a.m., Jan. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

The CHP received a report of a hit-and-run accident at the intersection of Saverien Drive and American River Drive. A vehicle had driven through and damaged a homeowner's lawn, leaving a trail of fluid as it continued northbound. The car was eventually found unoccupied in the parking lot of the animal clinic on Fair Oaks Boulevard. CHP handled the report.

I checked Ashton Park and the river access points. All were quiet.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Jan. 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I reviewed emails from two homeowners about a woman on North River Way with mental health issues. The neighbors reported that the woman was throwing knives and trash onto her own front lawn and that she had covered her front door with threatening handwritten notes.

I visited one of the neighbors who has a restraining order against the woman in question. I had a long conversation to see if we could brainstorm some ideas to help. I provided the 988 phone number, which is used to contact mental health services. I explained that their neighbor had not violated any dumping ordinances because she had thrown the trash onto her own property.

I said I would reach out to the Sheriff's Department's Problem Oriented Policing (POP) team to see if they can work with code enforcement to find any violations or gather information to assist the neighbors. I suggested that the neighbor continue to notify the Sheriff's Department if the woman violates the restraining order. I made sure to email the other homeowner the same information.

Overall it was good conversation. I explained that these things are not easily solved and can potentially go on for a few years.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Jan. 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I checked Ashton Park and the river access points, but observed no problems or issues.

I responded to an incomplete 911 hang-up call from a home in the 600 block of Regency Circle. Upon arrival, I discovered that a juvenile was playing on his phone. He was talked to about playing with 911 and was very apologetic.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Jan. 19-20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I reviewed the emails about the mentally ill resident on North River Way and made sure to drive by the area multiple times.

I observed no problems at Ashton Park or the river access points.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Jan. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was an email from a resident on Gordon Lane reporting an unknown person checking a mailbox at approximately 1 a.m. The resident included a Ring camera video of the incident. The subject appears to be driving a silver sedan, possibly a Honda Civic. He drives up to the mailbox and checks it from inside his vehicle. I passed the information on to the night shift deputy.

I was dispatched to a report of an unknown subject sleeping inside a tent at Fair Oaks Boulevard and Whilhaggin Drive. I conducted a search for the subject. I walked the green area along Fair Oaks Boulevard, but did not locate any campsites or transients. I also drove along Whilhaggin Drive, but did not see a suspicious person.

I received a message from the resident on Gordon Lane who reported seeing open mailboxes on Stewart Road, across Fair Oaks Boulevard from the WDDNA service area. I checked Stewart for open mailboxes, but did not locate any.

I checked Ashton Park and the river access points multiple times, but saw nothing of concern.

I monitored the following intersections:

- American River Drive at Saverien Drive
- American River Drive at Jacob
- Saverien at Ashton
- Arden Way at McClaren
- American River Drive at Ashton
- American River Drive at Estates

I observed no traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 20-21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

There was dense, cold fog again tonight. Visibility was poor.

I found a man in a parked vehicle at the river access point on Ashton. I had him move along.

There was another email about a mail theft on Gordon Lane. I advised the member to tell his neighbor to call the Sheriff's Department's non-emergency line to report the incident and file an online report about the mail theft.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I received an email from a member about traffic violations in the past occurring near Arden Way and McClaren. I spent some additional time in that area.

I checked all the river access points and the schools in the neighborhood. There were no concerns.

I cited a driver for a stop sign violation at American River Drive and Whilhaggin Drive.

I came upon a solicitor in the 1300 block of Meredith Way peddling lawn services. I told him he needed a solicitor's license and he left the neighborhood.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

I responded to a report of a truck parked on the sidewalk on Shelato Way, making it hard for people using the sidewalk to pass safely. When I arrived, the vehicle had been moved.

I responded to an email regarding mail theft on Gordon Lane. I spoke with a neighbor who had video footage of a gray sedan checking mailboxes on the street. The victim was not home, so I will make an incident report on behalf of the victim to document the activity.

I kept an eye on North River Way, where neighbors have reported issues with a homeowner with documented mental health issues.

Friday, 5 p.m.- 12 a.m., Jan. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes appeared secure.

At 8:10 p.m., I was flagged down near Arden Way and Fair Oaks Boulevard. A family reported that a house on Kingsford Drive was getting TP'd. I said I would check the area, but I also explained that there has been a friendly TP rivalry among kids in this neighborhood. In most cases, the parents are understanding and laugh about it. Sure enough, there was a doozy of a TP'd house on Kingsford. I still don't know how kids throw a roll of toilet paper 30 to 40 feet in the air but they did. I drove around looking for them, but they were not to be found.

Around 1:20 a.m., I received an email about kids playing loudly on the Ashton Park basketball courts. I arrived on scene within 10 minutes, but no one was around. I did discover a couple of open beer cans on the basketball courts. I emailed the homeowner to report what I found.

While I was on patrol, I stopped on Whitehall to speak with a couple of families with young kids outside. I let the kids have fun turning on my lights in the patrol car.

HOW TO CALL FOR HELP

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
