PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Recent neighborhood burglaries

In the last three months, burglaries were reported in the following locations in the WDDNA neighborhood:

- 4000 block of Greywell Way
- 3600 block of Fair Oaks Boulevard
- 4100 block of American River Drive
- 700 block of Whitehall Way
- 600 block of Regency Circle

Deputy patrol reports

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I read the emails about a mail theft bandit on a scooter. I spent the majority of the morning looking for him, but was unable to locate anyone matching the description.

I checked on a student at Jesuit High School who was suspected of being abused. The student appeared okay and said that he and his mom have disagreements, but that he felt safe at home. I relayed the information to Child Protective Services, which had filed the initial report.

I checked the river access points, but did not see anything suspicious.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 11-12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I forwarded a resident's complaint about parking enforcement in her neighborhood to the Parking Enforcement Division.

I searched in the area of Fair Oaks Boulevard and nearby streets in hopes of seeing the mail thief, but I did not see him during my shift.

I stopped and gave a verbal warning to a driver near Fair Oaks Boulevard and Kevington Court for not stopping at a red light before turning.

I checked Ashton Park around 10:30 p.m. and saw three parked cars. I spoke to a group of 10 teenagers in the park and told them that the park was closed. They were cooperative and quickly left the area.

I checked all schools and river access points, but did not see anything suspicious.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Oct. 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to Woodacre Court regarding a parking issue. There were two complaints about a truck parked partially on the sidewalk. The vehicle was gone upon my arrival.

I responded to a report of an abandoned truck on Shelley Way. Upon my arrival, I could see the truck's drive train hanging on the ground. A woman was standing by the truck and explained that a tow truck was on the way.

During my shift, I met with a community member who had information regarding a possible suspect who may be responsible for the recent mail thefts.

I checked the parks and river access points multiple times, but saw no problems.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Oct. 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was contacted by a deputy with the Sheriff's Department Problem Oriented Policing (POP) unit, who is assisting with the mail theft investigation.

I received an email regarding a red convertible Corvette that may have been abandoned in the 900 block of Sand Bar Circle. I determined that the vehicle was registered to an individual out of the area. My attempts to contact the owner were unsuccessful. I contacted parking enforcement and asked them to tag the car.

I received an email about a possible burglary in progress in the 1100 block of McClaren Drive. Upon my arrival, I determined that there was no burglary. Two salesmen in green vests were going door to door soliciting.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 15-16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was a very quiet evening.

I responded to an audible alarm on Lantern Court at 9:24 p.m. I recognized the address as being on our vacation check list., but the homeowners had come home early. I arrived in less than one minute and determined that the homeowners had accidentally set off the alarm.

At 3:15 a.m. I responded to an alarm at a hair salon at Arden Way and Fair Oaks Boulevard. I determined that the local security officer had set off the alarm while he was checking doors.

Wednesday 9:30 a.m.- 5:30 p.m., Oct. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I cited a vehicle in the 5200 block of Shelato Way for having an expired registration.

I checked the river access points and all were clear.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 18-19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All

homes were secure.

There were no high school games tonight and both high schools (and their parking lots) were closed for the evening.

I stopped by Ashton Park a few times throughout the night, but the normal high school crowd did not gather tonight. Vehicle traffic was steady until about 11p.m. Very few pedestrians were out.

I checked all schools, parks and river access points and maintained a heavy presence throughout the neighborhood all night.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Oct. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on all parks and river access points multiple times, but observed no problems.

I monitored the intersection at American River Drive and Saverien Drive, but did not witness any traffic violations.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Oct. 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Both high schools were in session and traffic was heavy for a bit

I responded to a panic alarm in the 700 block of Morris Way. The homeowner told me that he had pressed the wrong button.

I checked the parks and river access points. All were clear of any problems.

A small empty safe was located on the sidewalk at Arden Way and Kingsford Drive. The safe was collected and booked by patrol. It is not known where it came from.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 22-23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the parks and river access points. All were clear of any problems.

Wednesday 9:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Oct. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I cited a driver at Gary Way and Arden Way for a registration violation and other offenses.

I received an email from a resident about a car doing donuts near Jacob Lane and American River Drive. I thanked him for the information.

Thursday 8 a.m.-2 p.m., Oct. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

An email was sent regarding a parked vehicle. I checked the car and ran the registration. I determined that the registration was up to date and that the car was legally parked.

I responded to a burglar alarm which turned out to be false.

I cited a driver at Ashton and Guildford for a stop sign violation.

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
