



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Friday, 5 p.m.- 12 a.m., Oct. 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored major intersections and the area around Jesuit High School, which had an event this evening. I did not observe any traffic violations.

I checked area parks and river access points. Everything was quiet.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Oct. 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I contacted occupants of a car parked after hours at the Estates Drive river access points and had them move along.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Dunster. A house sitter had set the alarm incorrectly and the indoor cats had set off the interior alarm.

I responded to a report of suspicious people on Southwick. I contacted two people and the homeowner verified that they were authorized to be working on the house.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Oct. 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park several times, but observed no problems.

I monitored a number of intersections, but saw no traffic violations.

I responded to a 911 hang-up call in the 5300 block of Shelato Way, but it was cleared as accidental before I arrived.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., Oct. 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked river access points and Ashton Park multiple times. Vehicle and foot traffic was very light.

I responded to a report of a homeless person sleeping on a lawn in the 3900 block of American River Drive. I contacted the man and advised him to leave the neighborhood. He agreed to do so and walked toward Watt Avenue.

I responded to a report that the front door of a home in the 4600 block of American River Drive was wide open. I arrived and contacted a cleaning crew working there. They had been dropped off at the home, so there were no vehicles in the driveway or in front of the house.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 1300 block of Kingsford Drive. There was no answer at the door and the front of the home checked secure. I was unable to access the rear.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 14-15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was raining this evening, which kept everyone off the streets. I checked the river access points and Ashton Park, but saw no issues.

Wednesday 10 a.m.-2 p.m., Oct. 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked river access points and all the schools.

I responded to an alarm on Morris and determined that it was an accidental activation.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

While patrolling, I saw a man riding his golf cart on the street near American River Drive and Jacob Lane. I stopped him and explained that, under California law, a golf cart must be registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles before it can be used on public roadways.

I checked around Rio Americano High School, but saw no parking violations.

Friday, 5 p.m.- 12 a.m., Oct. 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored major intersections and the area around Jesuit High School, which had an event this evening. I saw no traffic violations.

I checked area parks and river access points. All were clear of any concerns.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Oct. 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of a large group of juveniles on electric bikes causing problems in the intersection of Estates and Crondall Drives. They were gone when I arrived and were last seen on the bike trail.

I responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle parked next to the complainant's home in the 3900 block of Wycombe Drive. It was gone when I arrived.

I monitored a few intersections, but observed no traffic violations. I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park. There were no problems or issues.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., Oct. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park multiple times, but didn't observe any problems. I monitored multiple intersections off American River Drive, but saw no traffic violations.

I responded to a report of a possible squatter situation at a home in the 4200 block of American River Drive. It turned out to be a civil matter and both parties were advised of their options.

I responded to a request for a welfare check on Sherlock Way. I checked the home, but didn't see any problems outside. A neighbor had a key and we checked the interior. Nobody was at home or in distress.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Oct. 21-22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored several intersections and stopped one driver for failing to stop at a stop sign. I issued a verbal warning.

I checked on all the river access points and Ashton Park. There were no issues of concern.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Oct. 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

At Ashton Park, the parking lot was being re-sealed so, there was no activity in the park.

A resident waved me down in Wyndgate to report that a neighbor told him she had seen a man looking into parked vehicles with a flashlight at 5:30 a.m. a few days ago. He said she did not call 911 because she felt it was not an emergency. I advised him that the non-emergency number is always a good alternative unless an active break-in is in progress. Then 911 should be called.

A man waved me down in the area of Gary and Meredith. He was concerned about accumulated junk and a derelict vehicle parked in a nearby driveway. I advised him that, as long as the debris was not in the street, there was nothing law enforcement could do. However, I also suggested he call the County Code Enforcement at 311 about the problem.

I monitored traffic at American River Drive intersections with Saverien Drive and Ashton. I observed no violations.

I checked the river access points and all were clear of problems.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Oct. 21-22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I did not observe any traffic violation tonight. I checked the area parks and river access points, but observed no issues.

Wednesday 10:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m., Oct. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked river access points and all the schools. I saw nothing of concern.

It was a quiet afternoon.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Oct. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I saw two vehicles driving in the bike lane on American River Drive just west of Wilhaggin Drive. I stopped the drivers and gave them verbal warnings.

I responded to a panic alarm at a home on Del Dayo Drive. It was an accidental activation.

I checked around Rio American High School and saw no parking issues.

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
