2026 Dues Reminder

If you have not yet paid, you can either pay the invoice that was emailed to you or you can go online to our website at WilhagginNA.com, log in and pay from your member portal. After you log in, you will see a list of links to the left of your membership information. Follow these simple steps:

1. Under the "Billing" link, click on "Invoices."
2. A list of your invoice history will appear. Invoices that have been paid will say "Paid" in green. Your most recent invoice is at the top. If you have not paid it, it will say "Sent" in blue.
3. If it says "Sent," you can either click on the invoice number or the "Action" button. Either action will take you to the invoice.
4. When your invoice appears, click on the blue "Pay Now" button at the top right and it will take you to a form that you can use to enter and submit your payment information.

If you prefer, you can pay by check. Make the check payable to WDDNA and mail it, along with your name and address, to WDDNA, P.O. Box 2273, Carmichael, CA 95609.

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Nov. 10-11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park multiple times, but saw no problems or issues.

I monitored several intersections on American River Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

I patrolled while running my overhead white lights to deter any criminal activity. It was a quiet night.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Nov. 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 scheduled vacation watch checks. All

homes were secure.

I checked all parkway access points and Ashton Park. I also checked Rio Americano High School, since there are no classes in session. I saw no suspicious activity or subjects on campus.

Ashton Park was very busy with families enjoying the holiday and cool weather. I did a security walk through and chatted with several parents and passed out a few stickers.

I stopped at the park later in the afternoon, when there were many more people. I contacted the parents of two teenage boys who were riding around the parking lot on E-scooters without helmets. I advised the parents that E-bikes are not permitted in the park and that riders must have helmets and valid driver's licenses or learner's permits. The parents agreed to put the two scooters back into their vehicle.

Due to the holiday, traffic was very light. There were no calls for service and I monitored several intersections for traffic violations but didn't see any worthy of a vehicle stop.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Nov. 11-12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all river access points and Ashton Park throughout the shift.

Tonight, there were more coyotes and gray foxes out than people. I saw several of each.

Wednesday 11 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Nov. 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 11 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I drove all streets several times, checked river access points and all three schools.

I monitored traffic at several main intersections, but did not see any major violations.

I did not see any transients in the area and very few residents were on the streets. It was quiet.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Nov. 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped and cited a driver for running the stop sign at Crondall and Estates. It was a Rio Americano High School teacher who was running late. I advised the driver that he should be setting an example for his students.

I assisted patrol with a panic alarm on Laverstock. The activation was accidental.

I received an email stating that a garage door had been left open on Keane Drive. Because I was busy elsewhere, I did not notice the email until several hours later and the garage door was closed when I arrived.

NOTE: If an issue requires an immediate response, it is best to call the Sheriff's Department non-emergency line at 916-874-5115 and dial 0 to bypass the recordings. If a Wilhaggin deputy is not immediately available, dispatch will send a regular patrol to respond.

A member reported some people in their back yard near Crondall and Estates. The yard checked clear. It was possibly a misunderstanding.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Nov. 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park multiple times, but I saw no

problems or issues.

I monitored several intersections on American River Drive. There were no traffic violations.

I responded to a report of a vehicle disturbance, but where was no vehicle when I arrived on scene.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Nov. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

The river access points and Ashton Park all checked.

It was a cool and somewhat rainy evening. Foot and vehicle traffic were light.

I responded to a burglar alarm at the Sheriff's Academy. However, one of our canine units was close by and handled the call.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., Nov. 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park multiple times throughout my shift. I didn't observe any issues.

I was dispatched to an incomplete 911 hang up call in the 4900 block of Kipling Drive. It was determined to be accidental.

I monitored a couple of intersections on American River Drive, but saw no traffic violations.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Nov. 17-18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park multiple times, and monitored several intersections for traffic violations on American River Drive. I observed no issues.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Nov. 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park several times. I observed no suspicious activities.

I responded to a report of a trespass on North River Way. There have been numerous calls to this location concerning an unwelcome ex-girlfriend who keeps showing up at the home. She left the area and a report was taken.

I monitored traffic at several key locations. I stopped and issued a verbal warning to a driver who failed to come to a complete stop at American River Drive and Saverien.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Nov. 18-19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 12 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and parks and paid special attention to a home where the homeowners were having problems with their sons' ex-girlfriend showing up.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Nov. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped and issued a verbal warning to a driver who was driving in the rain near

American River Drive and Piccadilly Circle without the headlights on.

I saw a vehicle stop behind another vehicle that had stopped at the sign at Jacob Lane and Oak Vista Drive. After the front vehicle proceeded through the intersection, the rear vehicle proceeded through the intersection without coming to a stop. I stopped the driver and issued a verbal warning.

I observed a vehicle driving in the rain without its headlights on near Jacob Lane and Keane Drive. I stopped the driver and gave a verbal warning.

While preparing to do a vacation check on McClaren Drive, I saw a vehicle without its headlights on in the rain, flashed my lights at the vehicle several times, but the driver still did not turn on the headlights. I stopped the driver, who said the lights were turned on. However, I noticed that the vehicle's light switch was set to automatic and did not illuminate the tail lights. Once the driver turned the switch to the manual setting, all the lights came on. I gave the driver a warning and suggested having the switch checked out.

I received an email from a member who had seen someone picking through his recycling bin at the curb. The homeowner wanted to know if that was a crime. I explained that it is technically a crime because the recyclables belong to the county or the waste management company as soon as the can is taken to the curb. However, because reporting the issue is cumbersome and time consuming, we usually just send the pickers away.

I cited a vehicle for being parked on the sidewalk on Shelato Way.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Nov. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

At 8 p.m., I was dispatched to assist patrol deputies with a possible burglary at Rio Americano High. Live security cameras were activated and San Juan Unified Dispatch was reporting that several kids were in the gym with flashlights. When I arrived, some of the kids ran from the scene to the fence line to the east. We were unable to find them. It did not appear that any vandalism or burglary had taken place. It was just a case of trespass through an unlocked gym door. San Juan sent a custodian over to lock up.

At 9:10 p.m. I saw two teenage boys riding bikes east on Fair Oaks Boulevard from Eastern holding two large 12-packs of toilet paper. I figured the young men were up to no good, with tonight being a Saturday night. But there was no reason to stop them because they were not technically doing anything illegal. However, around 9:30 p.m. I located their target. It was a house at the corner of Oak Vista and Macaulay Circle. I was unable to locate the kids, although I kept an eye out for them for the rest of my shift.

At 10 p.m. I responded to a burglar alarm in the 400 block of Wyndgate. It turned out to be an accident.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Nov. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped by Ashton Park and the river access points multiple times, but observed no problems.

I saw a group of juveniles running around Rio American High School in the evening. I stopped and advised them they were trespassing and that they needed to leave the property. They were cooperative and left.

I monitored a couple intersections, but did not observe any traffic violations.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., Nov. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points several times, but did not see any problems or issues. I monitored a couple intersections on American River Drive. I didn't observe any traffic violations.

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.

SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY (Not an emergency)

If you see someone engaged in suspicious activity but it is not an emergency, call 916-874-5115 (Sheriff's Department non-emergency line).
