



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Saturday, 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Nov. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It rained heavily, so vehicular and pedestrian traffic was light.

I rechecked two reported cases of problem parked cars and saw that parking enforcement had taken appropriate actions on both.

There was a request to check on the welfare of a resident. The individual turned out to be fine.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Nov. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on all the parks and river access points, but saw no issues.

I monitored American River Drive intersections at Harrington Drive and Saverien Drive, but did not observe any traffic violations.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., Nov. 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 3900 block of American River Drive. The residence was secure.

All parks and river access points checked clear of any problems.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Nov. 26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 27 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

All parks and river access points checked clear.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Nov. 28

Today was Thanksgiving. Because there were 49 homes on the vacation watch list, I was only able to drive by and remove packages and newspapers from affected homes. I did not have time to walk the properties.

I responded to a report of a suspicious person. The caller reported seeing a man parked by Del Dayo Elementary School who was wearing oddly colored clothing and a mask. The subject reportedly pulled a large, painted backpack out of his vehicle. I arrived and recognized the vehicle, which I had seen on other occasions around the neighborhood. It

could use a nice paint job, but otherwise checked clear. I later contacted the man, who was jogging with a large pet carrier strapped to his back. He checked clear and apparently parks his vehicle in the neighborhood while he goes for runs on the parkway. As for the mask: It was cold outside.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Nov. 29-30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an earlier email about a porch pirate. In response, I parked for periods of time all around the neighborhood to make my presence known.

I checked Ashton Park and found it clear of any problems. Arden Way leading into William Pond Recreation Area was open and unsecured all night. I drove through it several times and directed three different drivers to leave the area.

The cold weather kept most people indoors

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Dec. 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 34 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I replied to a member about a noise complaint and provided some options and advice.

All parks and river access points checked clear.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Dec. 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A community member reported a theft from a vehicle in the 600 block of Lake Wilhaggin Drive. Someone had opened a closed gate and entered an unlocked detached garage. I took a burglary report of the incident.

All parks and river accesses checked clear.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Dec. 3-4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email about a Sacramento Bee driver who was seen driving on the wrong side of the street on American River Drive during the morning hours when we do not have a WDDNA patrol. I provided the homeowner with some options, such as contacting CHP or making an online complaint with the Sacramento Bee.

I received a call about an abandoned USPS mail truck on Thornley Way. The truck was locked up and secure. It may have been left there because it had broken down. I called the 24-hour U.S. Postal Inspector line. They were aware of the situation and relayed the information to the local post office.

I noticed a few large unmarked vans driving around the neighborhood. I was suspicious of them, so I followed them around. They appeared to be dropping off Amazon packages.

Wednesday 9 a.m.-5 p.m., Dec. 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of a woman transient bothering homeowners near Castec Drive and Eastern Avenue. I could not locate her.

I noted that the abandoned mail truck was gone from Thornley Way.

I checked all the streets and river access points, but saw no problems.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Dec. 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Schools were back in session, but I saw no parking violations at or near the schools.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Keane Way. It had been accidentally activated by the construction crew working on the house.

While patrolling Shelato Way, I saw a detached flatbed utility trailer loaded with miscellaneous personal property parked on the street in front of a known nuisance house. The trailer had no license plate and there was no evidence of it being registered. I requested an abatement tow for the trailer. It was impounded, pending the legal owner registering it with DMV.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Dec. 6-7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I maintained high visibility along American River Drive until Rio Americano High School cleared out around 10:30 p.m.

The access to William Pond Recreation Area was closed and locked by the time I was on duty, and all other river access points were secure. I also checked all schools and parks in the neighborhood throughout the night. There was nothing significant to report.

I contacted two transients on bikes at two different times. They were leaving the river area. Both checked clear for warrants. I referred our Homeless Outreach Team to the areas where the transients had been camping for follow up.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Dec. 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was a lot of traffic tonight, so I maintained a visible presence in high-traffic areas.

I observed no issues at the river access points or local parks.

I responded to a homeowner who was concerned about threatening cell phone calls and texts sent to her by an unknown caller. There was no record of the caller's phone number in the Sheriff's computer system. So, I advised the homeowner to block the number to see if it would prevent future calls.

IN AN EMERGENCY

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
