



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Dec. 10-11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 9 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There were very few cars on the road. I maintained high visibility by driving around with my patrol car's wall of white light on.

The river access points and local parks all checked clear.

I saw a car being repossessed in the neighborhood, so I monitored the area to make sure the owner did not cause a problem.

Wednesday 10 a.m.-5 p.m., Dec. 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 11 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I contacted the driver of a vehicle that was sitting the middle of the intersection near Marlborough and Jacob Lane. The driver was lost and looking for an address in the neighborhood, so I gave him directions.

I checked all the streets, schools and river access points. It was a quiet afternoon.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Dec. 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was windy and raining heavily.

I completed some investigative work on a complaint of illegal dumping on Gordon Lane. Residents had video of a truck towing a trailer that dumped a load of dirt, grass and leaves on the grounds at Jesuit High School. I watched the video and identified the trailer as a Home Depot rental. With Home Depot's assistance, I located a rental contract with a possible match to the truck. DMV checks and door knocks led me the company owner. He said he was aware that his workers had not disposed of the load properly. He had them return and clean up the area. I advised him of the fines for illegal dumping.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Dec. 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all river access points and parks, but saw no issues.

I responded to an email about a suspicious truck driving up and down Gordon Lane in the early morning hours. Deputies will be monitoring the situation.

I had just finished driving by the problem house on Shelato and had parked at the intersection of Los Rios and American River Drive when a couple walked up and told me that they had seen a suspicious silver car drive up to that house. They said they suspected that the occupants of the car were waiting to squat at the house. I monitored the house and the surrounding streets, but did not see the car. I watched the house from afar to see if could notice any activity, but saw none.

There was a burglary at a vacant house in the 1200 block of Gary Way. A side door had been kicked open sometime within the last week and some clothing and other items were taken.

A special thanks to the Meyers family for baking boxes of Christmas cookies for our deputies. I picked them up and dropped them off to the Sheriff's Department North Station after first sampling a couple of them (Mmmm good!) Thanks, Ms. Meyers.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Dec. 17-18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 12 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a home that had been burglarized on Jacob Lane near Keane Drive over the weekend while the homeowner was away. The homeowner had filed a report and CSI came out to process for fingerprints. It appeared that the front door had been kicked open, possibly on Sunday morning, and items within the home were taken. The home is undergoing some renovation. I suggested more lighting out front until the remodel is complete.

There were very few cars on the road. It was cold and foggy again. I maintained a high visibility while driving around with my overhead white lights on so people knew there was a presence in the neighborhood.

The river access points and local parks all checked out with no issues.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Dec. 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 11 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A vehicle was reported to parking enforcement on Thistlewood. It was tagged by a parking enforcement officer with a 72-hour warning.

I checked the schools and all river access points and all was quiet.

Sunday, 7a.m. - 3 p.m., Dec. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the parks and river access points. They were clear of any issues.

I monitored traffic at American River Drive and Saverien Drive, but observed no violations. Traffic was fairly light.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Dec. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I answered one email regarding a stolen personal check. I provided the member with his options to report it.

I was dispatched to a burglar alarm in the 3900 block of Dunster Way. A check of the residence showed it was secure.

I responded to Ashton Park regarding a 13-year-old boy who was brandishing a knife and making others feel unsafe. A patrol deputy responded to cover me. We contacted the juvenile who had a six-inch knife on a table at the park. He was not cooperative and lied about his name and where he lived. After informing him that he could be taken to juvenile

hall, he directed us to his grandmother's home. He had been staying with her temporarily and was heading back to his mother's home in north Sacramento. We admonished him and released him to his grandmother.

HOW TO CALL FOR HELP

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
