



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Jan. 26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was an email from a member regarding a blue truck that frequently parks at the river access on Estates. I checked the area several times during my shift and didn't see it.

I responded to a residential burglar alarm in the 4400 block of Ashton Drive. The residence was secure and appeared to be undisturbed.

I monitored several intersections, but observed no traffic violations.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Jan. 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Today was a very nice almost spring-like day out. School was back in session and there were lots of people out and about.

I checked the parks and river access points. All were clear of any problems or issues.

I checked for a blue pickup truck reported to park regularly on Estates near the river access, but couldn't locate it.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Jan. 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

All river access points and Ashton Park checked clear of suspicious activities, as did Mystic Lane, Ashton Park Lane and Wyndgate communities.

A member asked for occasional patrols on Tamsen Court. The homeowner said his daughter and young children are concerned about a marital dispute. I was able to speak with the grandmother and obtained additional facts.

A home on Marlborough undergoing a remodel checked secure. However, an out building had an unlocked door. Nothing appeared disturbed and I notified the owner.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 28-29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all the river access points. Around 1:30 a.m. I saw a car parked on the street in front of Ashton Park. The driver was a young man. He was not doing anything illegal, but I stayed in the area to monitor him and so he could see that I was present. He left after

about 10 minutes.

Around midnight, I saw a transient man walking west on American River Drive from Wilhaggin carrying a blue tarp. I monitored him until he left the neighborhood.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Jan. 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email about a blue Ford pickup that parks near Crondall and Estates several mornings a week. It was gone when I arrived. I ran the truck's license number and found that it is clear and currently registered.

I responded to a report of suspicious circumstances call at the home on American River Drive where a homicide had recently been reported. I was the first to arrive and found the front door standing open with no one around. The front door had been kicked in and the house ransacked. Other patrol units responded and a report was taken.

Thursday 8 a.m.-2 p.m., Jan. 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped by the American River Drive homicide house three times during my shift, checking the doors and fences. I found no issues.

I stopped and cited a driver for running the stop sign at Jacob and American River Drive.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Feb. 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A Gordon Lane security camera recorded another incidence of a mailbox being checked at 1:15 a.m. by an unknown person. I checked the Sheriff's Department nearby license plate reader camera recording, but did not find any images matching the vehicle in question.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Feb. 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I drove by the American River Drive homicide house at least six times during my shiftm but saw no issues.

Around 9 p.m. I could hear cars doing donuts on the west end of American River Drive. When I got to the area, there were no cars.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Feb. 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I had an email from a homeowner in the 4100 block of American River Drive. A car had been rifled and a bicycle taken from the garage. I responded to the homeowner and advised them of their options.

I responded to an email from a homeowner in the 900 block of Saverien Drive. Someone had knocked on their front door at 12:45 a.m. I stopped by and discussed the situation with them.

All parks and river access points checked clear.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 400 block of Wyndgate Road. Upon my arrival, I

spoke with the homeowner and a caretaker. The alarm was in error.

All river access points and parks checked clear. I monitored several intersections, but saw no traffic violations.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to the 5000 block of Keane Drive. A vacant home had been forcibly entered. Code enforcement staff responded to board up the house.

I responded to an alarm in the 1400 block of Gary Way. It was false.

I noticed a man parked in front of a home on Selsey Court that was on the current vacation watch list. He identified himself as the adult son of the homeowner and had arrived to pick up a package they asked him to retrieve from the porch. His ID checked out.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Feb. 4-5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Because of recent activity in the area, I drove by Crondall and the west side of Wilhaggin along the river several extra times with all my white lights on so I could be seen. I did not see anything suspicious

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Feb. 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the schools and all river accesses. All was quiet.

I located a transient near Fair Oaks Boulevard and Watt Avenue. He checked clear and I gave him information about housing resources.

I responded to the 600 block of Regency Circle, where the 90-year-old resident had been scammed out of \$9,000. A person had called the victim saying that his adult son was in a bad car accident, had been arrested and needed bail money. The victim went to his bank, withdrew the money and gave it to the suspect, who picked it up from him at his home.

Thursday 8 a.m.-2 p.m., Feb. 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It rained most of the shift and few people were out walking.

I responded to three different burglar alarms. All were false.

I monitored traffic at Jacob and Keane, but observed no violations.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Feb. 7-8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was an email about a recent car break-in on Regency. I left it in the system for the daytime deputies to handle, but I spent a little extra time patrolling Regency.

It was a very cold night with minimal vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

All park gates were closed. Rio Americano High School had an event that wrapped up just before my shift began and the parking lot was cleared out by around 9:30 p.m. Ashton Park remained clear of the high school crowd and all schools and river access points checked clear throughout the night.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Feb. 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I answered a couple of emails regarding someone going through a mailbox in the middle of the night in the 1200 block of Gordon Lane.

There was a report of a suspicious subject who parked his bike on the lawn of a residence in the 900 block of Jacob Lane but left after the homeowner's dogs started barking.

The parks and river access points checked clear. I checked on the tennis courts at Ashton Park several times to be sure that there were no dogs off-leash.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a panic alarm at a home in the 4600 block of Ashton Drive. I determined that it was accidental.

I checked on the parks and river access points, but saw no problems.

IN AN EMERGENCY

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
