



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Jan. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I did some additional traffic monitoring in response to a complaint regarding stop sign runners on Arden Way. Most drivers took care after they saw my marked vehicle.

There were a few dogs off leash at Ashton Park. I reminded the owners that allowing dogs to run off leash violates a county ordinance.

I assisted a young driver near Rio Americano High School with a battery jump start. The teen drove off toward home after a call to a parent.

I responded to a ringing alarm on American River Drive. All doors appeared secured and the alarm reset.

A tree at a home on Kingsford Drive had been adorned with toilet paper. A teenager appeared to be working to clean up the mess.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Jan. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 13 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I paid extra attention to North River Way where a resident with mental health issues had been creating issues for her neighbors.

I checked Ashton Park and saw 10 or 15 teenagers on the play structure after dark. I stopped my vehicle in front of the park and they all took off running and left the area. I did not observe any signs of vandalism or littering. I returned to the park multiple times throughout the night, but the teenagers did not return.

I monitored multiple intersections, but observed no traffic violations.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Jan. 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There were a lot of folks out on walks this afternoon.

Around 4 p.m., I was waved down on Wilhaggin Drive by a resident who operates a business on the corner of Watt and Fair Oaks Boulevard. The person asked if I could contact a woman transient who would not leave the business property. I contacted the woman in question and arrested her for trespassing. A transport unit took her to jail.

I checked the schools, parks and river access points. There was an event at Rio Americano High School and there were many vehicles and a lot of activity late into the evening. But I observed nothing of concern.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Jan. 26-27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I received an email regarding the ongoing issues on North River Way with a neighbor with mental health issues. The email stated that the neighbor violated a restraining order and vandalized their front security door. Patrol units responded, but were unable to take the neighbor into custody at that time. I drove by that area multiple times throughout the night

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park. I saw no problems or issues.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Jan. 27-28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed earlier emails regarding the problems on North River Way. I learned that an arrest of the offending party had been made.

I checked on all parks and the river access points. There were no issues to report.

Wednesday 8:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m., Jan. 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked river access points and all three schools. All were clear of issues.

I cited a vehicle parked under a "no parking" sign on American River Drive near Rio Americano High School.

A resident reported a suspicious vehicle parked in the 4100 block of Ashton Drive. When I checked, it was gone.

I drove down North River Way several times. It was quiet.

Friday, 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., Jan. 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all the river access points and the schools. I saw no issues.

I checked the North River address several times. All was quiet at the house and all the junk had been removed from the front yard. The resident is in custody.

I cited a driver for a stop sign violation at Estates Drive and Wycombe Drive.

Friday, 8 p.m.- 4 a.m., Jan. 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Around 9 p.m., I responded to two calls for service. The first caller said he was driving home in his Tesla with his wife and small child when he noticed that a Porsche SUV was following them and acting suspicious. While I was driving to the location, the caller saw me and flashed his lights to get me to pull over. After talking through some possibilities, I said I would be on the lookout for the Porsche.

Then another call came in. This caller said he believed someone in a black Tesla was following him! He provided the license plate. It turned out to be the license plate of the first caller.

The irony was that both drivers lived on the same street just a few houses away from each other and, because they were taking the same streets on their way home, they both thought they were being pursued. We all had a laugh about it.

The fog rolled in thick after 1 a.m., but everything stayed quiet.

Saturday, 4-11 p.m., Jan. 31

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was some traffic along American River Drive most of the night, so I made sure to monitor several intersections.

I noticed a group of teens hanging out by their cars in front of Rio Americano High School. They were not doing anything wrong, but I kept a presence in the area, just in case.

All the parks and river access points were quiet with no issues to report.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Feb. 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park multiple times, but saw no problems.

I assisted patrol with a search of the Arden/Kingsford area for a homeless man who kept causing a disturbance near Bella Bru. We did not locate him.

I monitored a couple of intersections, but observed no traffic violations.

Monday-Tuesday 7 p.m. to 3 a.m., Feb. 2-3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was waved down by a resident in Wyndgate, who said someone rang her doorbell between midnight and 2 a.m. the night before. After discussing security measures that she could take, I assured her I would check again later. I checked the Wyndgate area twice between midnight and 2 a.m. Fortunately, I saw nothing suspicious.

Vehicle traffic was fairly steady until about midnight. There was an event at Rio Americano High School that kept cars in the lot until late. I checked on Ashton Park a few times to make sure students did not try to congregate there.

I checked on all parks and river access points. I noticed that the pedestrian gate at the Kingsford access point was unlocked and propped open. I notified the county operator to send someone out to close it.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park, but saw nothing of concern.

I monitored traffic at the following intersections:

- American River Drive at Saverien Drive
- American River Drive, Jacob and Saverien at Ashton
- Arden Way at McClaren
- Estates at American River Drive

I did not observe any traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Feb. 3-4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Around 2 a.m. I saw a loose dog walking down Saverien from Fair Oaks Boulevard. He looked like the dog from *Lady and the Tramp* all scruffy and curly haired. He appeared to have a collar. I tried to get him to come my way, but he got spooked and ran down Ashton. I decided not to follow him because I didn't want him running any further away from his home or put him at risk of running out into traffic.

The parks and river access points all checked clear. There was very little traffic. I saw two walkers late at night on Keane, but nothing suspicious.

I stopped a car near Arden Way and Gary. The rear brake lights were not on, but the head lights were. It appeared that the driver only had daytime running lights on. I warned the driver and explained the different features cars have and how to turn everything on properly.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Feb. 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was waved down about a possible unregistered vehicle parked on Gary. It was a very old Ford, possibly a Ranchero, with a registration sticker from 1985. The registration was so old that it had been purged from the DMV database. I contacted the homeowner where the car was parked and advised them to remove the vehicle immediately from the roadway or it could potentially be impounded until the registration fees are paid.

While monitoring calls for service, I saw that someone at a hospital was trying to contact a patient with a heart monitoring device. I called the patient until he answered the phone. He said he was OK and I suggested that he call the hospital.

Friday, 5 p.m.- 12 a.m., Feb. 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Around 10 p.m. I responded to a 911 hang-up call on Crondall Drive. It was an elderly person who was having problems dialing. She said she was OK.

The parks and river access points all checked clear.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Feb. 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I followed up on the situation on North River Way and confirmed the individual involved was still locked up until her court appearance.

I was waved down by a resident near Rio Americano High School who asked me to sign off on a "fix it" citation, so I did.

I stopped one driver for speeding and gave a verbal warning.

I spoke to a resident regarding surveillance cameras and used my phone to demonstrate their value by showing how my own home cameras worked.

Sunday, 6- a.m. -2 p.m., Feb. 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park, but saw no problems.

I monitored multiple intersections, but observed no traffic violations.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Feb. 9-10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

The river access points and parks were clear of any concerns.

Around 12:30 a.m., I assisted in a search for a missing person in the neighborhood. The reporting party reported that her husband had gone for a walk around 7 p.m., but did not return. We located him in the area and drove him home.

I monitored multiple intersections, but observed no traffic violations.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Both vehicular and foot traffic was unusually light throughout the day. I monitored several intersections. One driver failed to come to a complete stop at Crondall Drive and Estates. The driver pulled up next to me, acknowledged the violation and apologized before I could say anything. I gave her a verbal admonishment. Other than that, I didn't see anything worthy of a vehicle stop.

I was waved down on Gary Way by a resident concerned about vehicles blocking the intersection of Dye and Coolley near Del Dayo Elementary School. I advised the driver of one large pickup that was parked on the corner and partially blocking the road to relocate out of the lane of travel. She complied.

I walked thorough Ashton Park and noticed that some teenagers were using the play structure waiting for soccer practice to begin, but there was nothing of concern.

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
