



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all schools and river access points.

I received an e-mail from a resident about speeders on Crondall Drive and Estates. I will check on that tomorrow.

I was waved down by a resident on Selsey Court about a video she had of a man walking on her street in the middle of the night. It was very grainy.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Feb. 11-12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There were a couple of emails about a suspicious person seen in the area late at night. Another email reported someone in a car trying to get into a mailbox on Gordon Lane AROUND 1:30 a.m. both days.

I parked near Gordon Lane from 1:15 to 2 a.m. to see if I could catch the mailbox guy, but he never came around.

At 2 a.m., I responded to the 4100 block of Crondall Drive following a report that a suspicious man attempted to open the front door of a home. I arrived on scene within two minutes and detained the man. I identified him as a subject who had lived with his father in a home next door to the house four years ago. This subject is now homeless and lives near the river on the Rancho Cordova side. He is known to have mental health and drug related concerns. He had a bloody nose and lips, possibly from falling. He also may have been under the influence. He asked for transportation to an area hospital for treatment.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Feb. 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the schools and the river access points.

I took a report of elder abuse and attempted theft in the 700 block of Cortlandt Drive. The 92-year-old woman said she was locked out of her computer and called the bogus phone number on the screen. She was told to email a photo of her drivers' license and to transfer \$40,000 out of her investment account with her stock broker to get the computer freed up. Fortunately, the victim contacted her stock broker, who told her it was a scam and the money was not transferred. She did email her drivers' license photo to the scammer, so I advised her to check her bank statements closely and suggested she freeze her credit with the three major credit firms, so no one could access her accounts.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Feb. 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Ramel Way. The power had gone out and tripped the alarm, but everything was secure.

I monitored the stop sign at Crondall Drive and Estates. I watched as a 17-year-old driver on her way to school ran the stop sign while travelling at approximately 40 mph on a residential street. I stopped and cited her.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Feb. 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 39 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Throughout the shift I noticed a lot of teenagers driving around. I checked the local parks, but did not see any teens hanging around

At 6:19 p.m., I responded to a report of a drunk man who may have been involved in a fight and was sitting on the ground in the 1300 block of Kingsford Drive. I arrived on scene with two patrol K-9 officers for safety. There was a very drunk 25-year-old man who apparently had been kicked out of a nearby house for causing a disturbance. There was no fight. The young man had been visiting his girlfriend's house, when he discovered she was cheating on him with another man on Valentine's Day, and now he was emotionally distraught. We were able to get in contact with his grandmother, with whom he lives in Sacramento. I transported him to her house to save him further embarrassment. The transport also helped bring some peace and quiet to Kingsford Drive.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Feb. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 36 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the parks and river access points, but saw no problems or issues.

I monitored the intersection at American River and Saverien Drive. I didn't observe any traffic violations.

Monday 7:30 a.m. to 2 p.m., Feb. 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There were several people at the river access points today and lots of people outside walking around.

I responded to one burglar alarm, which turned out to be false.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 30 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Both Del Dayo Elementary and Rio Americano High School were closed today. Jesuit was in session and hosted a baseball game that attracted a lot of cars, but no issues.

I responded to a report of a naked man at Watt Avenue and Arden Way. He checked clear and left.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Feb. 18-19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was one email showing a porch pirate stealing a package and then leaving in a lowered red vehicle. I spent some time using our license plate readers in an attempt to track the vehicle, but I had no luck.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Feb. 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an alarm call in Arden Oaks. It checked clear. It was a quiet day.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Feb. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I took a crime report about an Amazon package theft that occurred on Sherlock Way around 7 a.m. a few days ago. The subjects were driving a red four-door vehicle.

I monitored the sign at McClarren Drive and Shelato Way. I stopped and issued a verbal warning to a driver for failing to come to a complete stop.

I was waved down by a man who was walking two dogs. He said he had found one of the dogs – a black Labrador retriever – which appeared to be lost. I took the dog to the VCA Country Oaks Animal Hospital on Fair Oaks Boulevard. I was able to track down the dog's owner from the microchip and reunite him with his owner.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Feb. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I encountered a disabled resident who was having difficulty getting out of the passenger seat of a vehicle and assisted getting them into the house.

I contacted two homeless individuals near Del Dayo School. Both checked clear and were sent on their way out of the neighborhood.

I signed a correctable citation for a resident.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Feb. 22**Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Feb. 23**

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was a nice springlike day. All parks and river access points checked clear of any problems or issues.

While patrolling on American River Drive at Wilhaggin Drive, I contacted a subject who was yelling and appeared to be homeless. I advised him that it was after dark and that he should turn around and head west on America River Drive. The subject was compliant and left the area.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 12 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 600 block of Cricket Court. Upon my arrival, I determined that the homeowner had temporarily forgotten her alarm code.

I responded to another burglar alarm in the 1300 block of McClaren Drive. I searched the front and back and found it to be secure.

I responded to a report of a stolen electric bike in the 5000 block of Jardin Lane. The victim had left the garage door open and the electric bike had been stolen between 2 and 3 p.m. on Sunday. The unknown suspect left his own bike behind, along with a few personal items

I checked on the parks and river access points. They checked clear of any problems or

concerns.

I monitored a couple of intersections, but saw no traffic violations.

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
