



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Feb. 10-11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It rained for a while and was windy late in the morning. There weren't many drivers out at all.

There was one incomplete telephone 911 hang up call from a call box on the parkway behind the 3900 block of Crondall. Patrol responded to the parkway. I checked Crondall and the local access points again to make sure no one entered the neighborhood and needed help.

Wednesday 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Feb. 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked river access points and all three schools, but saw no issues of concern. Things were quiet on North River Way.

It rained on and off all day.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Feb. 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 14 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all entrances to the parkway, but did not see anything anything suspicious.

Friday, 8 p.m.- 4 a.m., Feb. 13-14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to Genesee Court after a homeowner reported that a transient was outside their house wanting to know what happened to his truck that was parked on the street. The man was refusing to leave. There had been a previous call about that truck, which had very old expired plates. The owner could not be located, so the vehicle was towed. The man said he had just bought the truck and it had broken down around 9 a.m. that morning. He said he needed some time to get it fixed. Upon his return, he discovered it had been towed. I provided him with all the information about his truck's location and how he could contest the tow. He left the area but I made sure to drive by several times to make sure he did not come back.

Around 11 p.m., I contacted the occupant of a car at the Jacob Lane river access. It was a local homeowner just hanging out and I had him move along.

There was some traffic early in the shift but it disappeared after midnight.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., Feb. 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on Genesee Court to make sure there were no issue caused by last night's towed vehicle.

This morning, a homeowner had reported seeing a black truck parked in front of a fire hydrant on Jacob Lane. I drove to the location to check, but it was gone. I emailed the homeowner to acknowledged his request and I advised him the truck had moved on.

I contacted the occupants of a car at Ashton Park around 10 p.m. They likely were teenagers and moved along.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Feb. 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park.

The last half of the shift was very rainy.

I responded to a report of a suspicious occupied vehicle in the 600 block of Wilhaggin Drive. I contacted the driver and occupant, who had just picked up food at a nearby restaurant and were eating it. I advised them to leave the neighborhood.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure. One home had a pool service person there who was not listed on their vacation watch form, but I was able to contact them and verify that all was as it should be.

It was a rainy day so activity was lighter than usual.

Around 1 p.m., I performed a security review for a member in Wyndgate. We discussed various camera, security and monitoring systems. They mentioned having some recent late night doorbell rings and I showed them good locations where they could setup cameras and protect access points into their home.

All the schools were out for the holiday. I check all river access points, parks and schools, with no issues to report.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Feb. 16-17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park. I didn't observe any problems.

I monitored traffic at the following intersections:

- American River Drive & Jacob
- American River Drive & Saverien
- American River Drive & Ashton
- American River Drive & Estates
- American River Drive & Whilhaggin
- American River Drive & Kingsford
- Arden & McClaren
- Arden & Kingsford

I observed no traffic violations.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 listed vacation watch checks. Nearly all homes were secure. I located an unlocked door at one home on Del Dayo Drive. I

contacted the local contact and notified him. He arrived and secured the property. Nothing appeared to be disturbed.

I met with a homeowner in the 1400 block of Meredith Way. She said that around 11:30 p.m. Monday night, an unknown juvenile approached her home and kicked her front door twice. The kick left a shoe print on the door, but caused no damage. She said she believes the juvenile was the same girl who had draped toilet paper on her yard last year. The girl had arrived in a newer model SUV driven by an unknown person.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park, but observed no issues.

- American River Drive & Ashton
- Estates & American River Drive

I saw no traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Feb. 17-18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I made sure to provide extra patrols along Meredith, in case the girl who had kicked a door there Monday night returned. All was quiet.

The weather was cold, slightly windy and rainy. I saw no cars parked near the parks or river access points. Around 1 a.m., I contacted the occupants of one car parked in the Rio Americano High School parking lot under the solar panels. I had them move along.

Wednesday 7 a.m.- 3 p.m., Feb. 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all the river access points and Ashton Park several times. I saw no issues of concern.

A stopped a driver who failed to come to a complete stop on Arden at Kingsford and issued a verbal warning.

I stopped and cited another driver on American River Drive who had rolled through the stop sign at Wilhaggin.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Feb. 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of a woman wearing a robe who was seen walking around Arden Way and Fair Oaks Boulevard carrying a Teddy bear. While checking inside a nearby grocery store, I was advised by employees and customers that the woman is seen frequently, but causes no problems and does not appear to need assistance.

I checked Ashton Park and the river access points. I didn't see any issues.

I monitored several intersections along American River Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.- 4 a.m., Feb. 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of a missing teenager who had gone out for a run and had not yet returned. I assisted patrol and drove around the neighborhood to see if I could find him. He was eventually located near Ashton Park walking back from a team sports meeting. Everything turned out fine and he was taken home.

The streets were quiet tonight. I checked on Meredith Way to make sure the reported house wasn't having anymore issues with being TP'd.

No cars were parked near the parks or river access points. It was a very quiet Friday Night.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Feb. 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I contacted a woman who was walking from a river access point wearing no shoes and wrapped in a blanket. She agreed to be transported to the Hope Cooperative for potential services.

There was an individual pulling a cart along with his belongings near Wyndgate. He appeared to be looking for a location to set up, so I directed him to leave the area. He complied.

I was waved down by a man and woman who said they had just driven from Folsom looking for Sheriff's Department services. They said they had received a telephone call from a person claiming that they were in violation for missing a jury duty summons. For some reason, their GPS had directed them to the county building on American River Drive. I explained that the phone call they received had been a scam. Courts are not open on weekends and they never would have been contacted by phone. I called the phone number of the scammer and got a voice mail. I left a message stating that I was a Sheriff's representative and warned them that their call had been a fraud. The couple said the call had seemed very legitimate to them. The caller knew the man's name and address. I gave the man information about data security companies which can assist him in removing personal information from online directories and told him if the caller calls back, to advise him that a law enforcement report had been made.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Feb. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email from a member about an abandoned vehicle in the 800 block of Southwick Way. I located the vehicle, which had no license plates. I left a message for parking enforcement to address the issue in the morning.

I checked on the river access points and Ashton Park. It was a very nice day and I didn't observe any problems or issues.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Feb. 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 listed vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked river access points and the three schools in the area, but saw no issues. I checked on the mental health case on North River Way. The individual is still in custody.

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
