



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tuesday 7 a.m. to 2 p.m., March 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Ashton Park and all the river access points checked clear of suspicious vehicles or subjects.

I monitored traffic at Jacob Lane and Keane Drive where there was active construction in progress. I saw no violations. '

I also monitored the intersections at American River Drive and Ashton Drive and at McClaren Drive and Shelato Way. I observed no violations.

It was a very quiet day with little traffic, so I was able to patrol the entire area multiple times.

I was waved down twice by residents thanking us for our patrols.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., March 11-12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the parks and river access points, but observed no problems or concerns.

Patrol was dispatched to the gym at the corner of Arden Way and Fair Oaks Boulevard. A homeless man was reportedly yelling at customers walking to their cars. I checked the area, but could not locate him.

Wednesday 9 a.m.-5 p.m., March 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the schools and the river access points. Everything was as it should be.

I was waved down by a resident on Morris, who asked if I could sign off on a CHP citation for an equipment violation. I inspected the vehicle and signed off on the ticket.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., March 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I cited a driver for failing to stop at the stop sign at Crondall and Estates.

I cited another driver for not stopping at the stop sign on Estates and Wycombe. The vehicle also was unregistered and the driver did not have proof of insurance.

Saturday, 4-11 p.m., March 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and they were quiet. Around 11 p.m. I noticed a lot of cars parked in front of Ashton Park, but there was no one was in the park. So, I parked nearby to monitor the area and observed vehicles coming by to drop off people to pick up their cars. I determined there was nothing suspicious.

I was driving west on McClaren Drive west of Arden Way when I saw a black SUV with several teenagers standing outside of it. As I passed them, I heard a lot of laughing and I noticed that a house had been T-papered. I turned around to get a license plate in case there were any complaints. The car drove off when I made the u-turn, but I was able to get a license plate.

I drove around the block to look for the black SUV, but they were gone. I went back to check on the house and saw an SUV enter the driveway. When I shined my spotlight onto the other end of the driveway, I saw two teenage girls ducking down. Turns out, one of the teenagers kneeling down was celebrating her birthday and the occupants of the SUV pulling into the driveway were the mom and a friend. I explained what I saw to the young lady and mom and we all had a good laugh. I wished her a happy birthday and left.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., March 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

The shift started off dry, but quickly turned to rain. I responded to two emails. One was from this morning regarding people dumpster diving in the back of Rio Americano High School. I checked the area at the beginning of my shift, but no one was there.

I checked the river access points and parks, but saw no problems or issues.

Around 10 p.m., I observed an open garage door on American River Drive. I knocked on the front door and let them know. They thanked me.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., March 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored school traffic at the beginning of my shift, but saw no problems or issues.

I checked on the parks and river access points. All were quiet.

I monitored a couple of intersections on American River Drive, but saw no traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., March 18-19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email sent by a member who had seen a young man leave a parked car, walk away, then come back. The member was concerned that the car might have been stolen. I determined that the car was registered to a resident on a nearby street and had not been reported stolen.

I checked on the parks and river access points and saw no problems or issues.

At 11:45 p.m., I followed a car in the Del Dayo area that seemed to be out of place and the driver appeared to be avoiding me. I ultimately determined that the driver was a newspaper delivery man whom I had never seen in the neighborhood before.

Wednesday 1-5 p.m., March 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all scheduled vacation watch checks. All

homes were secure.

I checked all river access points and the three schools. Things were quiet.

I responded to a report of an unknown car parked in the driveway of the American River Drive house near Ashton that was the scene of a recent homicide. I determined that the daughter-in-law of the victim has moved into the home. She said she is going around to meet her neighbors so they will know she has moved in.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., March 20

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure. One of the members requested that I check their pool for unwanted guests. When I did, I observed two ducks enjoying a morning swim and I chased them off as requested.

I stopped a vehicle and gave a verbal warning to the driver for going a little fast on McClaren Drive.

I received a call regarding an unattached trailer parked illegally on Marlborough Way. I arrived and parking enforcement was on scene issuing a parking citation.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Jaimewood Court. The home was secure.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., March 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There were three reported incidents occurring within a short timeframe involving a person or persons kicking and damaging the front doors of neighborhood homes in the early morning hours. I suggested that WDDNA issue an alert about the problem and urge homeowners to immediately call 911 if they experience such an incident. The alert was sent.

I assisted a resident with a civil question and directed them to the correct contact for further assistance.

All river access points, parks and schools were clear of any problems.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., March 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed the email at the beginning of my shift and found several emails about door kicks on Shelato Way, Marlborough Way and Jacob Lane.

I stopped by the home on Shelato Way. There was no answer, so I left a voice message for the homeowner to call me.

I drove to the home on Marlborough and met with the victim, who showed me the damage and told me that they have Ring surveillance video. Information about the door kicks will be forwarded to the property crimes detective supervisor.

I responded to an incomplete 911 call at a home in the 5300 block of Jamiewood Court. There was no answer at the door and no one answered on the cell phone. The home was secure and appeared neat and orderly as I looked through the windows.

I checked the parks and river access points, but saw no problems.

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
