



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., March 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A member requested an occasional check in the area of Tameson, Keane and Kipling. I drove through the area several times and all checked clear.

I stopped and gave a verbal warning to a driver at Ashton and Morris for failing to come to a complete stop.

A member sent an email concerning a loud chainsaw being used at 5:30 a.m. today. He believed it was coming from the direction of Jesuit High School. I responded with information regarding Sacramento County code exemptions for public and private schools and parks.

A member in the 4000 block of American River Drive reported a suspicious vehicle and two subjects exiting and walking onto his property before returning to their vehicle. A Ring video of the vehicle showed a silver Mercedes or BMW convertible with black top.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., March 25-26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I read reports of door kicks in the neighborhood. I spent the night driving around with my forward and side white lights on to deter potential vandals.

I checked the parks and river access points. All were clear.

Around 2 a.m., I was dispatched to the 4000 block of Dunster Way where a homeowner reported that a heavy-set man was repeatedly knocking on his door. The homeowner was fearful of opening the door. I had two other patrol officers assist me in checking the area for 20-plus minutes, but did not locate anyone suspicious.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., March 26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and all three schools, but saw nothing of concern.

At Jacob Lane and Oak Vista Drive, I stopped a vehicle for not having any license plates. The driver said she just bought the vehicle and had recent purchase documents in the car.

A resident asked me about the door kicks that occurred last weekend. I said I was aware of three incidents on Marlborough, Shelato and Jacob, all occurring late at night on March

21. Two of the homes had double front doors. Two were corner houses. In one instance, a security camera recorded a vehicle. All the information has been sent to detectives.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., March 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped and cited a driver for driving in the bike lane and passing cars on the right. The young driver was a student of Rio Americano High school and I remembered having previously cited the same driver for a stop sign violation.

While on patrol, I noticed a car with a its door open parked in the driveway of a home on Thistlewood Drive. I contacted the homeowner, who had accidently left the door open and had forgotten about it.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., March 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of a large group of teenagers playing loud music at 10 p.m. I determined that no alcohol was involved and everyone left after being asked to do so.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., March 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the parks and river access points. All were clear of any problems.

I monitored intersections on American River Drive at Harrington and at Saverien, but observed no traffic violations.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., March 31

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I check on the parks and river access points. They were clear of any problems.

I received an email from a retired Sheriff's Sergeant who lives in the neighborhood and has a license plate reader camera. He had observed an older red Chevy Malibu associated with a recent porch pirate incident driving northbound on Jacob towards Fair Oaks Boulevard. I checked the area, but could not locate it.

A short time later I received an email that had been sent to a WDDNA board member regarding a vehicle burglary that occurred on Jacob Lane and Sherlock Way. A woman said something was stolen off the front passenger seat of her van. I arrived in the area, but the victim had left.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., April 3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all river access points and the schools. I stopped and counseled a youngster for riding his bicycle in an erratic way and for not wearing a helmet.

I cited a driver for running the stop sign at Wycombe Drive and Estates Drive.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., April 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I received an email regarding a door kick in the 1700 block of Haggin Grove Way. I contacted the homeowner and reviewed a Ring surveillance video. The two suspects wore hoodie sweatshirts and appeared to be in their late teens. There was no vehicle shown on the video and the front door was not damaged.

I monitored a couple of intersections on American River Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored school traffic in the morning, but didn't observe anything notable.

I checked on the parks and river access points. There were no problems.

A report came in from a woman whose car was broken into while it was parked at the intersection of Estates and Crondall. She had parked it there while riding her bicycle on the Parkway. Upon her return, she discovered that someone had broken out her rear passenger window and stolen her purse and a firearm. A community service officer was dispatched to take the report.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a member's message expressing concern about teenage drivers in the neighborhood. I explained that deputies make every effort to monitor such drivers during student commute hours, but that similar problems exist at multiple locations in the neighborhood. It is not possible for one deputy to be at multiple locations and, when a deputy does monitor an area, drivers tend to slow down, making it difficult to catch offenders.

I checked Ashton Park and all the river access points, but saw no issues.

At Saverien and Ashton, I stopped and cited a driver for failing to stop at the stop sign, for having no proof of insurance and for failing to register his recently purchased vehicle with the DMV.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., April 8-9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored American River Drive intersections at Saverign, Ashton and Jacob, but there were very few cars out and I saw no traffic violations.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., April 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an e-mail from a resident on Saverien Drive about transients going through his trash on pick-up today. They were gone when I arrived.

IN AN EMERGENCY

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
