



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., April 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped and cited a driver for driving in the bike lane and for passing cars on the right. The young driver is a student at Rio Americano High School

I was waved down by a resident who found a bag full of hand tools and a sling shot and wanted to turn them in as found property. I collected the items and booked them at the department's property storage facility.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., April 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 34 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I followed up with a resident who had reported a suspicious vehicle parked at the end of Gordon Lane.

On Meredith Way, I contacted the owner of a large motorhome that was legally parked on the street. I determined that it is owned by a resident who had recently sold the nearby home and will be moving it soon.

I spoke to a resident on Haggin Grove to obtain more information for detectives to use while investigating a door kick that occurred to her home on April 6.

Traffic was heavy today and I monitored stop signs on American River Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., April 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the parks and river access points and all were clear of any concerns.

At 9:30 p.m., a person walking a dog at the intersection of Keane and Jacob reported hearing a woman inside a home screaming for help. The dog walker called 911 and reported the incident. I immediately responded to the home, along with another patrol unit. When we arrived, we determined that the screaming had most likely come from kids playing in the backyard of a home on Kipling that backs up to the home on Keane Drive. No domestic violence or other crime had occurred.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., April 13

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the parks and river access points. All checked clear of any problems.

I monitored several intersections on American River Drive throughout my shift, but observed no traffic violations.

Wednesday 9:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., April 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points, but found no issues. Public schools were closed.

I received an e-mail from a resident on Keane Drive asking if I could move a recently delivered package from the front porch. I took care of it.

I responded to an alarm in the 500 block of Paharo Court. It was canceled by the owner.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., April 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 35 vacation watch checks. All the residences appeared secure except one on Gregory Way, which had a unlocked rear slider. I checked the exterior and interior, but found nothing. There were no signs of a burglary.

Because the public schools were closed, traffic was light. I observed no traffic violations during my shift.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Over the weekend when there was no WDDNA deputy on duty, we received an email from a member concerning his home on American River Drive that is on the market. The Ring camera on the home had captured a suspicious man entering the back yard and peering through the windows. The homeowner notified 911, but the subject was gone by the time deputies arrived. I updated the homeowner's vacation watch information to reflect the incident and drove by several times during my shift.

Ashton Park and the river access points all checked clear of any suspicious vehicles or subjects.

I monitored intersections around Ashton Park and at the intersection of Ashton and Saverien Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., April 22-23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Around 10 p.m., I contacted a group of young women in a car at Ashton Park and advised them that the park was closed. They moved along.

I did not see any transients going through trash cans and traffic was extremely light. All the river access points were clear. In all, it was a quiet night.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., April 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A resident waved me down to sign off on a ticket, which I did.

I came upon a small pickup truck parked halfway into a driveway on McClaren Drive. It was leaning to one side and the driver was trying to set up a jack to lift it. The right front tire had come off the wheel hub. I stopped to offer my assistance, but the driver said he was okay.

I responded to an email regarding a parked vehicle on Kipling Drive. The vehicle checked

clear and the member was advised to contact parking enforcement if the vehicle remains on the street for more than 72 hours or if it begins to show signs of being abandoned.

HOW TO CALL FOR HELP

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
