



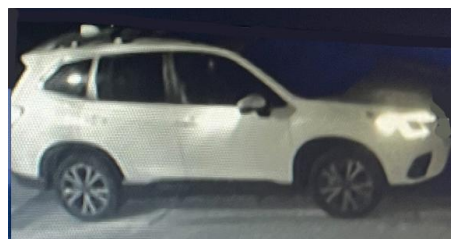
Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tires slashed on neighborhood vehicles

On April 25, a resident on McClaren Drive had her pickup truck vandalized while it was parked in the driveway. All four tires were slashed, fruit and sugar were dumped on the hood and possibly in the gas tank. A threatening note was taped to the window. Video of that night revealed that the perpetrator drove a newer Subaru Forester or Outback with a rack on top.



The victim filed a report and was later contacted by another neighborhood resident who also had the tires slashed on all three of his vehicles on April 29.

The victims believe that the perpetrator may be a student at Rio Americano High School. If you have information that may assist in identifying the perpetrator of these crimes, please contact WDDNA at wilhaggindelayona@gmail.com and we will alert our deputies.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., April 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked around the schools, but observed no parking violations.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., April 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored all river access points, Sand Bar Circle, Jacob Lane and American River Drive. All was quiet.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 vacation watch checks. All homes were

secure.

I patrolled the parks and river access points. All were clear of issues.

I monitored the intersection at American River Drive and Jacob Lane, but observed no traffic violations.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m., April 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email about a dog owner with a dog off leash at Ashton Park. I walked the entire park and spoke with several people. None of them had seen any dogs off leash. The sighting may have occurred earlier in the morning.

While patrolling around Rio Americano High School, I saw two vehicles illegally parked and issued each of them a parking citation.

I responded McClaren Drive about vandalism to vehicles and obtained video of the possible suspect.

I monitored traffic at several intersections, but saw no violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., April 30-May 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I spent extra time patrolling along McClaren Drive in response to reports of tires being slashed, but observed no suspicious activity.

I monitored the intersections at American River Drive and Jacob Lane and at Ashton and American River Drive for stop sign violators. I did not see any violations.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I drove the area in front of the Assessor's office on American River Drive near Watt Avenue to check the no-parking zone. I cited four vehicles for being illegally parked or stopped.

I cited a driver for not stopping at the stop sign at Estates and Wycombe.

At his request, I spoke with a member's son about the legal issues and harmful effects of vaping. I also spoke to staff at Rio Americano High School, who said there is not a big vaping problem on campus as there is on other schools in the district.

I spoke to a resident on Paisley Way regarding his unregistered vehicle that was illegally parked on the street. He said he was in the process of getting it registered. I advised him to park it in the driveway until it was registered.

I advised detectives of a possible student from Rio responsible for vandalisms in the area. Per school staff, the vandalism may be connected to verbal and/or physical fights that the student had with other students who live in the area. The vehicle common to the vandalisms is a white Subaru Forester or Outback with a Thule rack on top.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all the river access points and all were quiet.

I saw a man walking down McClaren Drive from Arden Way dragging his bag of recycle materials behind him. I stopped and asked him where he was headed and advised him that there were no businesses nearby. I also explained that it is illegal to dig through waste cans in front of homes and politely gave him directions back toward Rancho Cordova over the bridge at William Pond. I watched him as he made it through the park.

I stopped and cited drivers for running stop signs at Harrington and American River Drive and at Wilhaggin Drive and Wycombe.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

At one home on Oak Vista, the wind appeared to have blown over an open umbrella on a glass patio table, shattering the table top. I sent the owner an email advising of the damage.

I monitored several intersections for traffic violations but most drivers came to complete stops. However, at Shelato Way and McClaren Drive in front of Del Dayo School I stopped and issued a verbal warning to a driver for failing to come to a complete stop.

I drove by all river access points and the vacant lot on Crondall Drive, but observed no suspicious vehicles or activities.

I issued two parking violation citations near Rio Americano High School and warned drivers who were waiting in the no-stopping/no parking zones.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a request to check on the welfare of a woman resident on North River Way. She was okay.

I monitored the intersections at American River Drive and Wilhaggin and at Wycombe Drive and Estates, but observed no traffic violations.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I cited one driver and issued a verbal warning to another for not coming to a complete stop at Crondall Drive and Estates Drive.

I stopped and cited a driver on Fair Oaks Boulevard for going 65 mph instead of the 40 mph posted speed limit.

I stopped and issued a verbal warning to a driver for failing to come to a complete stop at American River Drive and Estates.

IN AN EMERGENCY

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
