



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., April 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Traffic was very light and I observed no traffic violations. All river access points were clear of issues, as was Ashton Park.

Monday 6 a.m. to 2 p.m., April 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the parks and river access points, but observed nothing of concern.

I monitored traffic around Rio Americano High School during the drop-off period. I stayed until approximately 8:30 a.m., then made my way to Del Dayo for their drop off time. I believe people are getting used to seeing me at both locations. They seem to be driving more safely and even wave as they drive by.

I looked for illegally parked vehicles during my shift, but did not see any violations.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., April 27-28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

At approximately 2 a.m., I responded to a family disturbance call in the 400 block of Groton Court. The family's 18-year-old son was experiencing a mental health episode and was damaging property inside the home. Patrol and I arrived at the location and had the family exit the home, except for the son. He calmed down while separated from his family. We provided the family with options for mental health resources and discussed a plan to obtain appropriate assistance.

I checked the river access points, but saw no problems or issues.

I monitored several intersections, but observed no traffic violations.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the area around Rio Americano High School and cited one vehicle for parking in the wrong direction.

I checked Ashton park and the levee access points several times during my shift. All were clear of problems.

I monitored school traffic around Rio American High School, but observed no violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., April 28-29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email regarding a mail theft on Gordon Lane. The report did not include a date or time of occurrence. A video showed a male driver pulling into a driveway in a GMC SUV. The vehicle does not appear to have a front license plate and may be displaying a temporary paper plate. However, it was unreadable. I emailed the homeowner requesting additional footage of the vehicle leaving the area so I could read the rear plate. I also advised them to file a report with the Postal Inspector if any mail was stolen. I will continue to monitor the area.

I checked local parks and river access points, but found nothing of concern.

Wednesday 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., April 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked river access points and all three schools. There was nothing of concern.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Sand Bar Circle. It was false.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., April 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I observed three vehicles parked in the No-Parking zone on American River Drive near Whitehall and issued all three parking citations.

Friday, 8 p.m.- 4 a.m., May 1-2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 36 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

At 10:30 p.m., I responded to the 5400 block of Tree Side Drive. A homeowner reported that a man was possibly under the influence and not moving from a front porch. I arrived on scene and the subject was detained. Patrol transported the individual out of the area.

At 10:30 p.m. there was a 911 hang-up from a call box on the parkway near the west end of Crondall Drive. I responded to the area, but found nothing unusual.

A 1:30 a.m. I responded to a report of a loud party on Columbia. The initial report suggested the house was vacant and that no one should have been there. Upon investigation, I determined that the homeowner had allowed his son to use the residence for a football team gathering. They were advised to quiet down and complied by ending the party.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., May 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 37 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Jesuit High School had a large sporting event that was posted throughout the affected parking overflow areas. However, there was a significant impact to the surrounding neighborhood, as well. Rio Americano High School also had a competition near the same time and I spent a great deal of time monitoring and addressing parkers who paid little attention to impeding walkways, driveways and fire hydrants.

Ashton Park was also operating at max capacity due to parties and parking overflow.

I stayed busy addressing the above situations my entire shift.

Saturday, 11 p.m. - 7 a.m., May 2-3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 34 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

The neighborhood was very quiet.

I checked all schools, parks and river access points. The gate to the river access on Jacob Lane was left open. I closed it twice during the shift and it was open again this morning

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., May 3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 35 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park several times, but observed no issues.

I monitored a couple intersections, but didn't observe any traffic violations.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., May 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Rio Americano High School appeared to be closed today, so there were no traffic issues in the area. I did not observe any traffic issues or violations at the major intersections. I had to warn two juveniles on E bikes to stay in the bike lane and not the roadway.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. May 4-5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all the river access points, parks and schools. All were clear of issues.

It rained much of the night, keeping most people off the roads or walking around.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It rained off and on during my shift, which kept foot traffic low.

I was waved-down by a couple on N. River Way. They reported that they had encountered a man with a small white dog on Ashton Drive yesterday. They said he was cursing out loud, called to them by name and made derogatory remarks about one of them. From their description, the man appeared to have been a known homeless man who grew up in the neighborhood. He went to school with their son and they were familiar with his family. Other than the foul language, he didn't cause any problems.

I walked through Ashton Park, but the only person I saw was a woman walking her dog.

I checked all river access points. All was quiet.

In the early afternoon, I issued three parking citations to vehicles illegally parked in the areas around Rio Americano High School.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., May 5-6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I made several checks of the river access points and Ashton Park throughout the night. I also made checks on Gordon Lane in response to a reported mail theft. Everything was

very quiet.

I responded to an audible interior motion alarm on Ramel. I checked the front door, peered through the available windows and knocked on the front door. There was no answer and the associated phone number would not allow me to leave a message. I called the alarm company back to let them know that we responded.

Wednesday 8:45 a.m.-4:45 p.m., May 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 16 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was an email from a resident on North River Way who said she is getting mean looks from her mentally disturbed neighbor, but no crime has occurred. I drove by a couple of times to be safe.

I responded to an alarm in the 1600 block of Gary Way. It was false.

I issued a citation for illegal parking in front of Rio American High School.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A member reached out to ask for evening and night patrols on Guildford due to a recent burglary.

I did not observe any parking violations while driving the neighborhood. I checked the river access points and Ashton Park, but saw no problems.

Friday, 8 p.m.- 4 a.m., May 8-9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed an email sent Thursday evening regarding a loud homeless female disturbing the peace on Elsdon. I emailed the homeowner and explained that there was no WDDNA deputy on duty at the time. I advised him that patrol deputies responded but did not locate anyone.

There were two burglar alarm activations within 10 minutes of each other in the 3400 and 2600 blocks of American River Drive. I assisted patrol to ensure that the coincidence did not indicate attacks by a group of burglars. The 3400 block alarm appeared to be a possible attempted break-in. Patrol handled it. The 3600 block alarm turned out to be caused by janitors who failed to properly secure the building.

There was a lot of vehicle traffic in the neighborhood, so I made sure to remain highly visible while on patrol.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., May 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I saw the previous emails regarding the burglary on Guildford and transient information around Elsdon and Ashton Park. The Guildford address appeared secure. I checked for transients, but saw none.

Jesuit High School was planning its prom, so there was a lot of activity back and forth during the day. Ashton Park was busy with celebratory activities. I spoke to two people regarding dogs running off leash and both secured their pets.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., May 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I handed out a few stickers to some kids at the local yogurt shop when I stopped to get a soda. They were happy to see a peace officer.

It must have been prom night. I saw nine Limos throughout my patrols coming and going throughout the evening. There weren't any kids hanging out at the parks tonight.

I checked on the new home construction on Guildford Court. The street was quiet.

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
