PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

WDDNA deputies help crack door-kick vandalism spree

On Tuesday, May 6, a WDDNA deputy and a property crime detective from the Sheriff's Department, met with the parents of one of the teenagers suspected of being responsible for a rash of late-night door kicking episodes around our neighborhood.

The deputy and detective contacted the parents and their son at their home after several WDDNA deputies, working together in recent days, had identified a vehicle associated with the door-kick incidents and determined the address to which the vehicle was registered.

According to Sgt. Gene Goff, the WDDNA deputy who met with the family, the goal was to bring a halt to the door-kicks, to prevent anyone from getting hurt and to get the parents involved in bringing an end to the vandalism.

Goff said the parents were shocked to learn what had been going on and were extremely upset about it. They are cooperating with the Sheriff's Department and the contact has already led to more information about the other door-kick participants.

Goff said the investigation so far suggests that several teenage boys who know each other were involved. The vandalized homes apparently were selected at random and the boys were not trying to break in. They were simply doing it for the thrill, he said.

The criminal investigation into the vandalism incidents is continuing, but Goff said he believes the door-kick spree is over.

DEPUTY PATROL REPORTS

Saturday, 5 p.m. to 2 a.m., April 26-27

I responded to an accident at Eastern and Fair Oaks Boulevard. When I arrived, the scene was turned over to CHP.

I read several emails reporting door kicks and vandalism last night between midnight and 4 a.m. There were reports of incidents on American River Drive and on Haggin Grove Way. There was video of an incident on Crondall Drive.

I took a report about the Crondall Drive incident and I walked up and down the street talking to neighbors who had video cameras in an attempt to get a license plate image. I was approached by a resident on Jacob Lane who said he could provide me with information about a possible vehicle associated with the vandalism.

As I was leaving the Jacob Lane home, I was approached by the owner of the American River Drive home. She said her front doors were damaged and she wanted to report it on behalf of her elderly tenant.

I entered information into the department system to provide other WDDNA deputies a description of the vehicle of interest and emailed the property crimes detective sergeant to inform him of the events. I emailed the North Patrol Sergeant and Problem Oriented Policing team to have them show the video of the vehicle and subjects to their teams so they could be aware when patrolling the area.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., April 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed the email at the beginning of my shift. I had just returned from a two-week vacation and saw that there were a bunch of new door kick incidents.

There was a parking complaint on Woodacre Court. I saw the vehicle and contacted the registered owner, who moved it so as not to obstruct the sidewalk.

I checked the parks and river access points, but observed no problems. I monitored several intersections along American River Drive. I saw no traffic violations.

I assisted patrol with a report of an at-risk missing person, but we could not locate the individual.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored school traffic. Jesuit was closed due to a network outage issue. Traffic was heavy at times, but I did not observe any problems.

The parks and river access points all checked clear. I monitored several intersections on American River Drive, but saw no traffic violations.

I received an email from a member who received a warning that a motion alarm had gone off in his home in the early morning hours. He asked me to check his home. I did so and everything appeared secure.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., April 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was waved down about an illegally parked vehicle on American River Drive at Whitehall. I cited the vehicle.

I was waved down about a suspicious vehicle parked on Estates Drive near American River Drive in front of a house undergoing landscape work. It turned out to belong to one of the landscapers. I cited it for having an expired registration.

I assisted patrol searching for an Arden Way business burglary suspect. He was arrested near Morse and Northrup.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., April 29-30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I made sure to spend extra time throughout the shift driving on Crandall, Haggin Grove, Jacob and American River Drive to make sure the door-kick car wasn't in the area tonight.

The roads were fairly quiet. There wasn't much vehicle traffic. I spoke to a Jesuit baseball coach, who was locking up late and wanted to say hello.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., April 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all the river access points and the three schools. There were no problems.

I responded to a report of elder abuse in the 700 block of Cortlandt Drive. The adult son was reportedly stealing from his elderly parents. I took the report.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 1

I patrolled the neighborhood. Due to time spent following up on recent vandalism reports, I was only able to complete five vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I read about numerous vandalisms in the neighborhood Friday night and early Saturday morning. I saw that several vandalism victims still needed to be contacted. I spent time contacting them and took a few statements and/or reports. One resident on Morris Way had a rock thrown through a front window. The resident had completed an online report and gave me the rock. I booked it into evidence.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., May 3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I completed a lot of investigative follow-up work on the series of door-kick vandalisms. I provided information for our crime analyst to use to assist our detectives and stressed the importance of attention to this situation. They are very helpful and working on all of the reports.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., May 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I received an email from a member regarding a homeless woman sleeping on someone's lawn. The subject was last seen on American River Drive west of Saverien. I located the woman, who had a shopping cart and bicycle with her. I identified her and sent on her way towards Watt Avenue. She was cooperative.

I checked the parks and river access points several times but did not observe any problems.

I monitored traffic at a couple intersections of American River Drive, but saw no traffic violations.

Monday 7 a.m. to 11: a.m., May 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored school traffic at the beginning of school. It was busy, but flowed well. I checked on the parks and river access points. All were quiet.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A resident on Lake Oak Court talked to me about numerous drunk drivers who have crashed into their gate divider. She expressed appreciation for seeing our patrols inside their small community.

A citizen waved me down at Harrington and American River Drive to report that a red Acura TLX was parked in a no stopping zone near the entrance to the bike trail on Harrington. I checked out the vehicle, which had expired registration. As I was in the process of contacting parking enforcement, the owner returned. I advised him to keep the vehicle off the road until he gets it properly registered. He moved it into a nearby driveway.

I monitored the intersections of Ashton at American River Drive and Ashton at Saverien Drive. I saw no traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 6:30 p.m.-2:30 a.m., May 6-7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of trespassing at Jesuit High School around 10:30 p.m. The 911 caller saw two subjects walking onto campus carrying flashlights and was worried about recent vandalism and theft at the school. I was nearby and it took me less than a minute to be on scene. I determined that it was just two adults who had parked on American River Drive and were walking in the neighborhood. They had no criminal history. I called the complainant back to inform him of the outcome.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all the river access points and the schools that were in session. All was as it should be.

I cited a driver for running the red signal at Fair Oaks Boulevard and Arden Way. And I cited two cars parked on American River Drive at Whitehall in violation of a No Parking sign.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I drove past the schools and saw two vehicles illegally parked near Rio Americano High School. One was in a no parking zone, the other was almost angle parked with the rear end sticking out into the bike lane. I cited both vehicles. One for being in a no parking zone and the other for being in excess of 18 inches from the curb.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., May 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed 26 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There were lots of folks out enjoying the evening tonight. I stopped to say hi to a few of them.

All the river access points checked clear. There were no issues at the parks.

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
