



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Sunday, 5-11 p.m., May 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park at the beginning of my shift. The Harrington access was very busy with families and fishing. I didn't observe any problems.

I checked on the Phelps Court home with fallen tree damage. The exterior was secure.

I monitored a couple of intersections, but observed no traffic violations.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., May 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed an email chain between a resident and Wilhaggin deputies detailing harassment by a passing driver. Deputies were able to identify the individual and tried to contact him but had been unable to do so. I drove to the subject's home, but there was no answer at the door.

I spent time on American River Drive and all park areas because many people were out and about. Schools were closed, so parked cars and heavy traffic were not a problem.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., May 26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

All river access points were checked and were free of any unwanted activities.

I checked the side streets near Rio Americano High School, but saw no parking violations. I monitored several intersections along American River Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., May 26-27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points, Phelps Court and Jamie Court. There was nothing of concern.

The only car of concern was a vehicle parked on Estates near Wycombe with a man sitting inside. I checked his license plate and determined that he lived nearby.

I monitored several intersections along American River Drive and gave the schools extra attention in case there were any kids thinking about end-of-year pranks. I did not observe any activity.

Wednesday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure. I watered some flowers that were dying and moved some parcels out of sight.

I spent time conducting high-visibility patrols in and around Ashton Park, as well as the various American River access points. I also checked on Jaimewood Court, but did not observe any suspicious activity.

I attempted to contact the registered owner of a vehicle seen driving recklessly. I left a voicemail but did not receive a return call.

I monitored traffic along American River Drive. Traffic conditions and neighborhood activity were calm and I observed no significant issues.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., May 28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

In the morning I spent time looking for the gray Honda sedan whose driver has been terrorizing morning commuters on Estates Drive. Since the new year, a member has had numerous encounters observing the reckless driver and has reported it to law enforcement. I never did see the vehicle. I later saw a California Highway Patrol motor officer and advised him of the vehicle and description. He said he would keep an eye out for him.

While watching traffic on Estates, I observed a vehicle driving south on Estates towards Wycombe. The vehicle approached the intersection controlled by a three-way stop sign slowing just enough to make the right turn to go westbound on Wycombe. I stopped the driver and asked him if he had seen me sitting at the intersection. He said he had not. I issued a citation for the stop sign violation and the driver said, "I guess you don't believe in giving warnings." I replied, "The fact you said you didn't even see me in front of you was concerning to me so, no."

I assisted patrol with an incomplete 911 call near the area of American River Drive and Wyndgate. I did not see any issues and no one in the area waved me down.

There were a few occupied vehicles parked along American River Drive. I advised them that there was no parking in that area and that they should pull into the parking lot. One of the drivers had run out of gas and was waiting for roadside assistance.

Friday, 5 p.m.- 12 a.m., May 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 31 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points, Phelps Court and Jamiewood Court. There was nothing new to report.

I observed two cars driving around during the night registered to the same address in Arden Park. Both cars had teenagers inside. I made note of their license plates in case any activity popped up. I hoped that seeing me drive around kept them from making any mischief.

I monitored several intersections along American River Drive and paid extra attention to area schools in case there were any kids thinking of engaging in year-end pranks. I did not observe any.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., May 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was provided information from a prior request for a home security check on Glen Aulin Court. I reviewed suggestions that had been made to the homeowner by a previous deputy and offered a few new suggestions for additional security measures.

During the shift I checked on Estates Drive in response to a prior speeding complaint. I made two stops and advised the drivers to slow down.

I contacted two people seated in a car parked at a river access point. They said they were taking a break from a walk.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., May 31

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 30 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was a beautiful day. I checked the river access points and Ashton Park several times. The Harrington access was very busy, but I observed no problems.

I was dispatched to a home under construction on Cortlandt Drive. I contacted a man just inside the chain-link gate. He said his parents used to live there. I advised him not to return and I had him transported to the hospital after he reported medical complaints.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., June 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

As the school year is winding down, I spent the morning on American River Drive near Rio Americano High School, then at Del Dayo Elementary during drop-off hours. No enforcement action was needed, outside of a few friendly reminders not to block bike lanes. Once school let out, I patrolled areas surrounding the schools checking for illegally parked cars, but everyone was parked correctly.

I patrolled the neighborhood, maintaining high visibility at parks, schools and recreation areas.

Just after 12:30 p.m., I was waved down by a CHP officer regarding our "discourteous driver" from last week. The CHP officer had located the driver while doing speed enforcement near Fair Oaks Boulevard and Jardin. He spoke to the driver, advised him of the complaints and discouraged his behavior. According to the officer, the subject seemed receptive to the advice.

In the afternoon, I kept a presence around the schools during pickup hours.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., June 1-2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park multiple times throughout the evening.

Per a homeowner's request, I conducted extra patrols through Jaime Court several times during the night. I did not observe anything unusual.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Philomene Court. The call indicated that the master bedroom slider alarm had been activated. Nothing appeared suspicious. I spoke with the homeowner, who explained that the alarm was activated accidentally.

I monitored several intersections, but did not observe any traffic violations.

Tuesday 6:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., June 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed recent patrol logs and emails and, in response, made checks on Jamie Wood Court and Phelps Court.

A resident waved me down to report that his work truck had been broken into at 4:40 a.m. on May 28 while it was parked in his driveway in the 1200 block of Meredith Way. Power tools had been stolen from the cab. Although he filed an on-line report, he had questions concerning the process and provided me a limited description of the suspect that was captured on his security camera. The suspect was a man wearing a distinct Blue Hoodie with white lettering on the left sleeve and an image of a white fish skeleton on the back. I answered his questions and told him I would include the description in my patrol log.

The Phelps Court home had a truck parked in front. I walked to the rear yard and confirmed that it was the pool maintenance man. Otherwise, the residence appeared secure.

I walked through Ashton Park, which was unusually busy with last day of school celebrations. I enjoyed chatting with adults and kids during my walk and several said they appreciated having a deputy in the park.

Rio Americano High School appeared to still be in session, so I monitored the traffic and issued a parking citation to a truck parked in the No Parking zone near Whitehall Way. Traffic was fairly light today. I didn't observe any traffic violations that justified a vehicle stop.

A home on Robin Lane that was on the vacation watch list had an SUV in the driveway with the hatch open. I contacted the owner who verified that she was the daughter of the homeowner. She and her young son were checking on the house.

I checked all river access points and Ashton Park. I saw no issues.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., June 2-3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points, Phelps Court, area parks and schools. It cooled off quickly once the sun went down and there was not much vehicle or pedestrian traffic.,

Around 1 a.m., I noticed that the garage door at a home in the 1200 block of Meredith Way was fully open. There were several bicycles propped up near the door that could have easily been stolen if the door were left open. I was able to wake up the homeowner and advise him to close the garage.

Wednesday 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., June 3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all river access points and the three schools. I also checked North River Way for any issues regarding the resident with mental health issues. All was quiet.

I received an email from a resident on Estates Drive about a man who came to their front door this morning and asked a bunch of nonsense questions. He left when the homeowner told him to. I checked the immediate area but was unable to locate him.

I responded to the 4500 block of Fair Oaks Boulevard in response to a report of a vehicle blocking the resident's driveway. The driver said he ran out of gas and that he has a friend coming to assist. The vehicle and subject checked clear.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I cited a driver who failed to stop at the stop sign at Wycombe and Estates. I issued a verbal warning to another driver who failed to come to a complete stop at the same intersection.

I received an email stating that subjects had been seen going into some bushes on Fair Oaks Boulevard near Eastern Drive. I checked the area and did not see any homeless encampment.

The rest of the day was quiet.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., June 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was an email from a resident on Robin Lane earlier in the week advising of a potential encampment in progress on Fair Oaks Boulevard near Eastern. I located the area where the occupancy could have been and walked through the property. It appears to be an unattended extension of another property with a home and I did not locate any transient activity.

I was waved down by a resident concerned about a large number of vehicles parking along Ashton near the park. It appears there were several events occurring at the park and a small group of individuals had brought their classic cars. I didn't observe any parking violations, but I monitored the area throughout my shift.

I assisted a resident concerned about an abandoned cat and suggested a rescue organization that could possibly assist.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., June 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a homeowner who was inquiring about a letter provided to him about possible unwanted activity on Gary Way. I made sure to drive through the 1500 block of Gary and check license plates to see if any were related to unwanted activity in the area. All the license plates were registered and parked legally.

I responded to an email regarding a truck parked in front of an address on Wycombe Way. I investigated the truck and responded to the homeowner.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., June 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park. There were lots of people in the park and at the river, but I did not observe any problems.

I monitored a couple of intersections, but saw no traffic violations.

I spoke to several juveniles on electric bikes that didn't have proper lighting on them. I advised them to get the problem fixed.

Monday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., June 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure. I located unlocked rear doors at two homes. Both homes appeared undisturbed. I locked the doors.

I responded to an audible alarm on Sherlock Way. The house was locked and I saw nothing suspicious. There was an Amazon package on the front porch. The delivery

person may have set off the front door alarm.

I conducted a high-visibility patrol at Ashton Park. All dogs were on leashes.

I monitored traffic at Arden Way and McClaren and at Ashton Drive and Saverien Drive. I saw no violations.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., June 8-9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the parks and river access areas to ensure no homeless individuals had setup camp for the night. Everything checked clear.

Vehicle and foot traffic were light. I responded to an alarm call on Sand Bar Circle. It turned out to be false.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., June 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I monitored several intersections that cross American River Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

I monitored the student activity at Rio Americano High School. There were no issues. I checked the side streets near Rio for parking violations, but saw none. There was a lot of traffic during dismissal, so I monitored the traffic but saw observed no violations.

I checked the river access points and Ashton Park. There were no issues.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., June 9-10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I followed up on a Saturday email from a member who reported that a derelict pickup truck was parked on Wycombe. I determined that the truck had been left there by an auction company. A staff person from the company called me Monday and explained that the truck had broken down and had been parked on Wycombe until a tow truck could be dispatched. I checked and saw that the truck was gone.

I spent time in the area of Gary and Arden Way to check for suspicious activity. There was none tonight.

I monitored several intersections along American River Drive, but did not observe any traffic violations.

At Ashton Park, I had two separate vehicles full of young people move along so they did not congregate and create noise that might disturb neighbors.

Wednesday 7 a.m.-3 p.m., June 10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure. One home on Keane Drive that is undergoing remodeling had a box truck backed into the driveway and the garage door was open. I entered the garage and contacted a man and woman who were opening a large appliance box. The woman turned out to be the owner and the man was a contractor.

Early during my shift, I noticed an email from a member in the area of American River Drive and Estates Drive concerning a homeless woman seen throwing rocks. I called the reporting party, who told me that the house next to hers was vacant and might have been occupied by the homeless woman. I drove through the area and walked around Ashton Park trying to locate the subject, but was not successful.

More than two hours later, I received an email from a different resident reporting what appeared to be the same person on Mariemont Avenue north of Fair Oaks Boulevard near Eastern. She reportedly was yelling threats to nobody in particular. I responded to the email and encouraged the reporting party to call either 911 or the Sheriff's Department non-emergency number to report such incidents for a timely response.

Rio Americano High School and Del Dayo Elementary School are out of session, so traffic was very light. I monitored Ashton at American River Drive and several other intersections, but did not see any traffic violations.

I checked the river access points, but saw no issues of concern.

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
