



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., June 10-11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Tonight was busier than usual.

I received an email report about potential trespassers in the early morning hours on a property that is for sale near Sovereign and American River Drive. A security video indicated that intoxicated young adults in swim gear were thinking of hanging out in the property's spa, but they ultimately did not do so.

I received an email from a member who received a phone call claiming that he had failed to appear for jury duty and that an arrest warrant would be served unless he sent money to clear it. I informed the homeowner that it was likely a scam. The homeowner did the correct thing and hung up. I provided him with the Sacramento County jury duty line if he actually wanted to call to reassure himself he did not miss jury duty.

I responded to a report of a loud teenage party on Chancery around 10:30 p.m. I contacted a woman who said she was 21 and that the house belongs to her parents. She listened to what I had to say and immediately shut down the party. My I stood by for 15 minutes while about 100 people left peacefully.

I responded to a report that a person's car was locked in the Ashton Park parking lot. I informed the owner that the park is managed by Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District and that I did not have the gate keys. He decided to leave his car and pick it up in the morning.

Wednesday 10 a.m.-2 p.m., June 11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 20 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a home in the 5300 block of Shelato Way because the mail carrier was concerned about piled up mail in the mailbox. The house was secured and I was unable to make entry. I made several phone calls to the resident and relative with no luck.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., June 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 34 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

The park and river access areas checked clear of any problems or issues.

I monitored several intersections on American River Drive, but observed no traffic violations.

Wednesday 10:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m., June 18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked all the river access points, but saw no concerns.

I received an e-mail from a resident about an unattached trailer parked illegally on Shelato Way. I cited it and contacted the owner. She was apologetic and said it would be moved.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed emails about the driver of a black Audi driving recklessly on American River Drive and parking in front of a fire hydrant on Ashton drive. I drove the area, but did not find the vehicle.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., June 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I assisted a resident who had driven away for a vacation, but forgot to close the trunk of the car. Several items had fallen out onto the roadway. The driver collected them and drove away, again. However, I later found a piece of luggage on the roadside containing medication. I found the homeowners' telephone number and notified them that I had the luggage. They had no idea it was missing and returned home once again to retrieve it.

I warned two people about potential parking violations near Ashton Park. Both moved their cars.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., June 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

The neighborhood was much quieter than the last Saturday night I worked.

There was a large after-hours fundraiser at William Pond Park tonight. A lot of people showed up, but there were no major traffic issues.

All the parks and river access points checked clear of any concerns.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., June 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 30 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on the parks and river access points, but saw no problems or issues. There were lots of people hanging out at the river today.

I monitored multiple intersections, but didn't observe any traffic violations.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., June 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped by the parks and river access points multiple times, but saw no problems or issues. I monitored a few intersections along American River Drive. There were no traffic violations.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., June 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure. One had an open side door behind the locked gate and I noticed an elderly man working in the back yard. He identified himself as the owner and explained that he and his wife had returned and forgotten to notify deputies.

Another home on the vacation watch list had a construction van parked in front of the open

garage. After attempting to call the owner's contact numbers, I rang the doorbell and the owner explained that they were back from their trip.

A homeowner waved me down on Keane Drive concerning a landscaper they hired from the NextDoor.com app. The homeowner had paid a deposit up front. The landscaper did a little bit of work, then never returned. Several other homeowners were rumored to have had the same problem with this landscaper. I advised that this appeared to be a civil matter. The landscaper is described as Hispanic, 5'5, stout build, in his early 40's and sometimes drives a dark red Nissan Altima or work truck with "MATIAS TREE SERVICE" signage.

I issued a verbal warning to a driver who failed to come to a complete stop at Ashton and Saverien Drive.

IN AN EMERGENCY

- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
