



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., June 25-26

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I recognized a crown Victoria parked on the side of the road with two males inside – one a juvenile and one an adult. Although they were not doing anything wrong, I stayed in the area to monitor them because I was aware that one of them has been a problem. I wanted to make sure they knew there was a law enforcement presence in the neighborhood tonight.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 30 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

All was quiet and all the river access points checked clear for suspicious activity. Ashton Park was busy with kids signed up for 2024 Camp Kids Ashton.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., June 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report of an abandoned vehicle with an expired registration on Jacob Lane. It was gone when I arrived.

A resident waved me down at Ashton Park to report that the utility access behind the bathrooms had been left unlocked after Friday's summer camp. I notified park officials to respond.

I received a call from another WDDNA deputy who had received information of a man going door to door asking for money. He forwarded a photo of the man and his vehicle. I had seen him a short time before the call, so I went back to the location and found his car with an Idaho license plate. I waited with the car until the man returned. I asked him what he was doing. He showed me his identification and employee badge with "Aptive" pest control services. He said he was contacting residents to see if they wanted pest services. I verified his credentials and I told him that vigilant members of the neighborhood association had reported his activities. He was cooperative and polite, then got in his car and moved on.

I received information about teens hanging out at Ashton Park in the evening and also of a homeowner who had scheduled a reunion party, but was worried that an uninvited man might show up to disrupt the festivities. I red-flagged the information for a night shift officer.

I responded to a report of a parked car blocking a fire hydrant. I checked the area and the car was gone.

Sunday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., June 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Today was a pretty hot day! There were lots of people out and about.

I responded to a WDDNA member who was inquiring about deputy coverage on the 4th of July.

I checked the Harrington river access area multiple times. It was very busy with rafters and people playing in the water. Sacramento MetroFire showed up to check people for life vests and overall river safety.

I parked along American River Drive at Jesuit to monitor traffic as it got dark. Traffic was light and I observed no violations.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., July 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Today was another hot day!

I was dispatched to an incomplete 911 call in the 4700 block of Dover Court. Upon my arrival, I noticed the home was undergoing roofing work. I checked with the work crews and the homeowner who pulled up just before me. Everyone said they were okay.

I was advised by multiple residents they had seen a small mountain lion or bobcat in the neighborhood off Harrington Drive and in the parkway.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., July 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a call by the daughter of people who own a home on Marlborough Way that is undergoing repairs. A neighbor reported seeing two men walking around the front of the house in the middle of the night and making noise that got her attention. I walked the perimeter of the property with the daughter and checked the outside and inside of the home. We saw no problems. Cameras are posted on the property and they did not pick up any activity. I suggested some increased camera placements.

All river access points were free of any issues. I checked Ashton Park twice, but saw nothing of concern.

Traffic was very light and I observed no violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., July 2-3

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 34 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I reviewed a homeowner's video of potential bike thieves so I could make sure to be aware if I saw them in the neighborhood tonight.

I contacted several carloads of teens hanging out at Ashton park and had them move along. More cars kept showing up sporadically through the shift. So, I stayed in the area to monitor the activity and make my presence known.

I heard lots of fireworks going off, but I could not pinpoint the source.

Thursday 1 pm.-9 p.m., July 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 46 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

A concerned citizen reported that the residents on Marimoore Way had blocked off a

majority of their street. I drove to the location to see if they had petitioned the county for a permit allowing them to close off the street. The homeowners had not done so and were advised to remove the blockade, which they happily did and said they would seek a permit for future events.

I stopped a vehicle that had run the stop sign at American River Drive and Saverien Drive and cited the driver for that, for driving on a suspended license and for having no proof of insurance. The driver said she was just trying to keep up with another family member who was in driving in another vehicle ahead of her. That car also had not stopped at the sign, but I couldn't catch them.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., July 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was sweltering hot and there was little to no movement in the neighborhood. Parks and schools were quiet.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., July 6

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 36 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I spent some time near Ashton Park to make sure kids were not hanging around or causing problems. The area was quiet.

Sunday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., July 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 36 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I patrolled the river access points and the parks. There were lots of people at the river. All parks and river accesses checked clear of any issues. I hung out at Ashton Park for a while to make sure there were no rowdy teenagers. It was quiet.

I received an email from a member regarding a vehicle doing doughnuts in front of Rio Americano High School. I arrived a couple minutes later, but the vehicle was gone.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., July 8

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Today was another hot one! Foot and bike traffic was fairly quiet.

I checked all river access points and parks, but observed no issues. I monitored the intersection at American River Drive and Ashton Drive. Traffic was light and I saw no violations.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., July 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

While checking the backyard of one home, I saw two women taking plants out into the backyard. They identified themselves as a cleaning crew that comes every other Tuesday. I contacted the owner, who confirmed.

I noted that there is a recurring issue of cars doing doughnuts in areas along American River Drive. mostly during the evening hours.

There was a report of a couple removing recycled items from curbside bins. A photo of the vehicle's license plate and occupants was clear enough to identify them. However, I did not see them during my shift.

All river access points and parks checked clear of problems.

I responded to a burglar alarm on Stowe Way. There were no signs of forced entry or

other suspicious activities. I advised the owner and notified the alarm company.

Traffic was very light. I monitored a couple of problem intersections for stop sign violations, but did not see any.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., July 9-10

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

The weather was a little bit cooler today. A few people were out walking their dogs and taking advantage of it.

I checked all the river accesses points and parks, but did not observe anything concerning. I provided high visibility patrol tonight, driving with my overhead white light on to deter any nefarious activity.

IN AN EMERGENCY

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
