



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., June 25

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email regarding a parked vehicle on American River Drive near Jesuit High School. I notified parking enforcement, which responded and tagged the vehicle.

I received an email from a member who reported being told by a custodian at Del Dayo Elementary School that people may have been partying on school grounds on the weekends and had left trash behind. The member wanted us to be on the lookout for suspicious weekend activities.

All schools were out of session, so there was very little vehicular traffic.

Friday, 8 p.m.- 4 a.m., June 26-17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 22 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

At a home on Jacob Lane that was being remodeled, I noticed a front window in the open position. I had patrol assist me, in case burglars may have been inside. As I shined my light into the house, I could hear two doors slam in the back of the house. The home owner eventually arrived and showed me around. Nothing appeared out of place and she secured the window.

In response to reports of weekend parties on Del Dayo Elementary School grounds, I hung out for 30 minutes around 1 a.m., but observed no signs of partying.

I responded to a report of a loud party in the 5000 block of Keane Drive. Patrol assisted, since the reporting party said there were 50 people at the party. We advised the occupants to quiet down. In response, the party began to shut down.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., June 27

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a report that a transient was seen drinking from hoses at a home near American River Drive and Wilhaggin. I drove to the location, but was unable to locate the individual.

I checked the river access points, Ashton Park and Rio Americano High school, but observed nothing of concern.

Late in the afternoon, there was a report that a red Jeep had pulled into the cul de sac on Gordon Lane last night and dumped dirt and debris onto the hood of a homeowner's truck.

We were advised to keep an eye out for the Jeep.

Saturday-Sunday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., June 27-28

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the parks and river access points to make sure no gatherings or camps were being setup. The Ashton Park parking lot gates were unlocked, as were the river access gates. I maintained heavy patrols around those areas for most of the night.

At approximately 1 a.m., I stopped an individual on a bicycle at Arden Way and Gary who did not have a headlamp on. He checked clear and I issued a verbal warning.

Traffic was heavy tonight, but everyone was driving safely.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., June 29

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I spoke to a homeowner near American River Drive and Jacob regarding a vehicle parked in front of his home. It had cobwebs, was extremely dirty and was out of registration. I advised the him that he needed to remove the vehicle or it would be towed away. He said he would do so. When I drove by two hours later, it was gone.

I assisted patrol in locating and detaining a suspect being sought in regard to an assault with a deadly weapon. The suspect had reportedly beaten an elderly man at the corner of Fair Oaks Boulevard and Watt Avenue. I located the suspect northeast of that location where he had gone into a house. We established a perimeter, obtained a warrant, forced our way into the house and arrested him.

I was advised that a homeowner on McClaren Drive near Los Rios, had been stringing an extension cord across the sidewalk in front of the house to charge a vehicle. The cord posed a danger to pedestrians. However, when I checked during my shift, there was no extension cord across the sidewalk.

I monitored several intersections, but did not observe any traffic violations.

Monday-Tuesday 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., June 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

In response to earlier reports of an extension cord being strung across a sidewalk to charge a vehicle parked in front of a home on McClaren, I drove to that location. I saw three vehicles parked on the sidewalk. However, there was no extension cord.

I checked the schools, parks and river access points, but observed no issues. However, the gates at the river access points were all unlocked.

Vehicle traffic was fairly steady throughout the neighborhood until about 12:30 a.m., then started to pick up again around 4 a.m. I maintained high visibility along American River Drive and monitored areas near Rio Americano High School and Watt Avenue, where vehicles seemed to be moving the most.

Tuesday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., June 30

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the river access areas and all were clear of problems.

I walked through Ashton Park, where a day camp was underway with approximately 35 children and camp counselors. I passed out a number of stickers and chatted with parents.

I monitored several intersections and issued a verbal warning to one driver who failed to come to a complete stop at Saverien Drive and American River Drive.

Both Rio Americano High School and Del Dayo Elementary School were clear of any suspicious activity.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., June 30-July 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 19 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I was driving north on Jacob Lane approaching Fair Oaks Boulevard when I heard, then saw a black Charger driving eastbound on Fair Oaks Boulevard at 100-plus miles per hour. He saw me and turned off all his lights. By the time I could safely turn onto Fair Oaks Boulevard, he was well past Arden Way. I checked the area for him to make sure he had not entered the neighborhood, but he was nowhere to be found.

Wednesday 9 a.m.-5 p.m., July 1

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I maintained visibility on the main thoroughfares to deter speeding and stop sign violations.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., July 2

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 21 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

While patrolling, I saw a mail truck parked on the side of the road and a red pickup in the middle of the street. The mail carrier was loading a package into the truck. I reported the suspicious behavior to the postal inspector, but later learned that the driver of the pickup truck was the mail carrier's supervisor. He was assisting the mail carrier with a delivery.

All schools were out of session, so there was very little vehicular traffic.

Friday, 8 p.m.- 4 a.m., July 3-4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was lots of activity in the neighborhood tonight.

I was dispatched to Ashton Park, where two people had their car trapped behind the locked gates. Unfortunately, only Mission Oaks Park staff have keys, so I was unable to open the gate. Since the car could not be freed from the parking lot, I gave the young lady and her dog a ride home to her mother's. Her boyfriend took an Uber to south Sacramento.

I responded to a report that people were using the swimming pool at Rio Americano High School. I contacted them and advised them to leave the area.

I responded to an email from a member who reported that a home in the 600 block of Morris Way had its garage door open and that a 1965 Mustang Cobra was parked inside. I arrived at the address and tried knocking several times, but there was no answer. I suspected that the homeowner was fast asleep. So, I closed the garage with the interior button and ran out, stepping over the sensors.

There was another garage door found open in the 1400 block of Thistlewood. No one answered that door, either

There were lots of fireworks going off tonight. A handful were within the neighborhood, but I could not locate them in time to advise the residents of the law. Things finally quieted down around 2 a.m.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., July 4

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was a large 4th of July fun run through the neighborhood, then there was an unofficial parade with kids, bikes and families. I followed with overhead lights for the kids.

Later, I stopped kids on E-bikes riding recklessly and had a chat with their parents.

Ashton Park was full of people and vehicles were parked everywhere. I monitored the river access points, but there were no notable concerns.

Sunday, 3-11 9 p.m., July 5

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was extremely hot today, so pedestrian traffic was light.

I monitored the river access points and Ashton Park, but saw nothing of concern. I checked Del Dayo Elementary School, but there were no signs of trespassing.

Tuesday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., July 7

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 26 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I stopped at the house under construction on Cortlandt Drive and spoke with the foreman. He said there had been no issues with the prior owner's son and that he does not leave any valuable tools or equipment at the site.

Traffic was, extremely light and I observed no violations.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., July 9

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 24 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

All schools were out of session, so there was very little vehicular traffic and I saw no violations. All the river access points were clear.

It was a quiet day in the neighborhood.

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
