



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., July 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 23 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

There was a lot of traffic related to a baseball game at Rio Americano High School.

It was extremely hot this afternoon.

I monitored the river access points, which were being heavily utilized, but I saw no issues of concern.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., July 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 15 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Today was a nice warm summer day.

There were emails regarding a residential burglary in the 300 Block of Claydon Way on July 11. I determined that patrol had responded and had taken a burglary report. Video surveillance showed two suspects had broken a rear sliding glass door to gain access and had stolen numerous items. I stopped by the home and spoke with the homeowner. I provided contact information for our property crimes detective bureau and gave her some safety tips to help prevent future burglaries.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 1500 block of Elsdon Circle. The alarm activation came from the living room. I checked the home and it appeared secure. I spoke with the homeowner, who said he believed the air conditioning had triggered the alarm by causing a plant to move.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., July 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 18 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email from a member who was concerned that an elderly person on Claydon Way had left her garage door open all night. I arrived at the location to find the garage was closed and nothing appeared out of order. I attempted to call the reporting party but, there was no answer. I sent him an email with a request that he contact me if there were any other concerns.

I responded to a report that a suspicious U-Haul truck was seen driving around the area of American River Drive and Jacob Lane. The truck had a male driver and female passenger. I located the vehicle parked in the 4800 block of American River Drive and contacted two people who fit the description standing in a nearby driveway. They said a friend lived at the location. The occupants of the home said they knew the people, but that they did not want them there. Neither of the subjects had a valid driver's license. I called the U-Haul

company contact, who advised me that the vehicle was 14 days overdue for return. I requested that they send a tow truck to retrieve the vehicle. The truck was towed and the occupants walked up to Fair Oaks Boulevard to wait for a ride from a friend.

I cited a driver for failing to stop at the stop sign in front of Ashton Park.

A resident waved me down in front of Rio Americano High School to report that a young male driver blew through the stop sign in front of the school yesterday. He reportedly drove between his car and another vehicle, nearly striking them. The resident said he followed the young man to a nearby home and gave me the license number and a description of the vehicle. He asked if I could respond. I thanked him for the information, but explained that I could not legally cite a driver unless I had personally observed the violation.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., July 15-16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 17 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was a cool evening and there were a lot of walkers out in the early evening.

I reviewed the video of the July 11 burglary on Claydon Way and kept an eye out for a similar vehicle that might be in the neighborhood.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., July 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email from a member asking what the allowed hours for construction noise in Sacramento County are. In Sacramento County, construction noise is generally allowed between 6 a.m. and 8 p.m. on weekdays and from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on weekends. Construction activities outside these hours are restricted, with some exceptions for unforeseen or unavoidable circumstances.

Saturday, 4-10 p.m., July 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I received an email asking that a package be moved to a backyard. I did so.

I responded to a call for service regarding three women stranded in the rapids near William Pond Park. Their raft had popped and they had underestimated the current. I helped assist until the fire department could respond. They were rescued and park rangers transported them out of the area,

I responded to an email about a loud party on Estates Drove. I drove by, but everything seemed quiet. I emailed the complainant and advised.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., July 21

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked on Ashton Park and the river access points. All of them checked free of any problems or concerns.

Towards the end of my shift, I received an email regarding a member on Claydon Way who had someone come to front door and leave behind a solicitation card. The home in question had experienced a burglary on July 11 and this action caused concern that the woman might be casing the homes on that block. I reviewed a video that showed what appeared to be a teenage girl placing a card on the door while talking on the phone. I attempted to call the phone number of the reporting person, but the number seemed to be out of service.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., July 22-23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 29 scheduled vacation watch checks. All

homes were secure.

I checked on Ashton Park and the river access points, but observed nothing of concern.

Around 1 a.m., I assisted park rangers at William Pond Park responding to a report of a man wearing a black shirt and shorts riding off on an e-bike toward the Wilhaggin area. A witness had reported seeing him fire a hand gun at a bathroom in the park.

When I checked the area, I located two men riding black e-bikes north on Jacob from American River Drive. They did not come to a complete stop at the stop sign and one of them was wearing black shorts. When the men saw me, they cut through Fair Oaks Boulevard and Jacob toward Del Dayo, then split up and went their separate ways. I was able to stop one of them and the other was located a short time later. We found no firearm on either man and they had no known criminal history. One said he was raised in the area and the other said he was from Citrus Heights. They said they like to just ride around at night. We could not connect them to a crime. We explained the reasons for the stop and sent them on their way.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., July 24

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to an email from a member whose home on Claydon Way had been burglarized on July 11. The homeowner was concerned about a woman who had come to their door and left a business card for a cleaning service. But when the homeowner called the number on the card, she said that the person who answered acted confused and didn't know what she was talking about. She was afraid that the woman may have been casing the neighborhood. She also wanted an update on her burglary. I looked into the case and learned that CSI had found no fingerprints, suggesting that the burglars had been wearing gloves.

I responded to an email regarding a parked car on Gary Way that appeared to be unregistered and possibly abandoned. I located the vehicle, which was covered in a thick layer of dirt and cobwebs. A records check revealed that the vehicle had a current registration. I spoke with the owners, advised them of the unsightly vehicle and suggested that they wash it and put it in use. I also explained that a vehicle that is parked in one spot on the street for more than 72 hours may be subject to towing. .

While on patrol, I observed another vehicle near McClaren Drive and Los Rios that was also covered in dirt and cobwebs and was missing both license plates. A check of the VIN revealed that it was currently registered. I cited it for not having license plates.

HOW TO CALL FOR HELP

IN AN EMERGENCY

If you have an immediate emergency - if your life or property is in immediate danger, if you feel threatened by someone on or near your property, if you have just become the victim of a crime or if you are witnessing a crime in progress:

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
