



Twice-Monthly Patrol Report filed by WDDNA's Off-Duty Sheriff's Deputies

PATROL DEPUTY REPORTS

Past Two Weeks Reported in Chronological Order

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Sept. 10-11

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

The weather was nice and cool tonight. I saw nobody out after 11 p.m., but I did see a group of four deer near Jacob and American River Drive in front yards eating landscape plants.

All parks and river access points were clear.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Sept. 12

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 38 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to one burglar alarm, which proved to be false.

A woman waved me down. She said a package was delivered to her home that did not belong to her. I advised her of how to return it to UPS.

Saturday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m., Sept. 14

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a member who had concerns about a recent burglary on Dovercourt and to another member who inquired about parking near stop signs.

There was another request on Guildford regarding an SUV parked there. I determined that the vehicle is owned and currently registered to a person living at the corner of Ashton and Guildford Court. When I saw it last week, it was parked legally and was not obstructing anything. Someone had driven it during the day and it had moved during my shift. Today, there was another email asking that the owner be advised of the 72-hour parking limit. I again went by and found that the vehicle wasn't there and did not return during my shift. I replied to the complainant advising them to contact parking enforcement and ask them to mark the tire to establish a violation if one is occurring.

I stopped a driver who rolled through a stop sign on Jacob Lane. He immediately pulled over and explained that he was from out of town dropping his son off for a Rubik's cube tournament and did not see the sign in time to thoroughly stop. I issued a verbal warning.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Sept. 15

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 36 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I received an email regarding a suspicious older Ford pickup truck that was parked in front of a home in the 600 block of Regency Circle. The homeowner recently passed away and

the home had been burglarized recently. The truck was registered to a subject in Fair Oaks. I checked on the home several times during my shift.

I noted a report of someone driving a dark sedan into the Harrington river access after dark at a high rate of speed. The vehicle was gone upon my arrival.

All parks and river access points checked clear of any issues.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Sept. 16

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 30 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 400 block of Wyndgate Road. The alarm was activated at the front door. I arrived a few minutes later and contacted the homeowner who said the activation was accidental.

I monitored the intersection at Harrington and American River Drive but observed no traffic violations.

All parks and river access points were clear.

Tuesday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Sept. 17

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 27 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I checked the unoccupied home on Regency Circle three times during my shift, but observed no suspicious people or vehicles.

All river access points checked clear.

I monitored traffic at American River Drive and Ashton and at Savarien and Ashton, but observed no violations.

Tuesday-Wednesday 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Sept. 17-18

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 25 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

Today was a nice cool night with a full harvest moon and partial eclipse.

I monitored the intersections at Ashton and American River Drive and Arden Way and Kingsford drive, but traffic was light and I observed no violations.

The parks and river access points checked clear. I drove down Regency Circle a few times in response to member concerns.

Thursday 8 a.m.-4 p.m., Sept. 19

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 28 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I maintained a high visibility patrol throughout my shift. I checked all river access points, but found no issues. I kept a watch for speeders along American River Drive, but observed none.

I monitored Jacob Lane and Keane Drive, but saw no traffic violations.

Friday-Saturday, 8 p.m.-4 a.m., Sept. 20-21

I began my shift on American River Drive as the Jesuit High School football game was underway. When the game was over, everyone left in a fairly orderly fashion. The parking lot at Rio Americano High School was left open until about 11:30 p.m. They had an away game and the team bus returned to campus later in the evening. I observed no issues at either school.

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 34 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

After midnight, the neighborhood was fairly quiet. I checked all the schools, river access points and Ashton Park. There were no issues to report.

Sunday, 3-11 p.m., Sept. 22

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 33 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

I responded to emails regarding a found backpack and a loud party.

I reviewed a member's surveillance video of a man who was looking in the mailbox of a home in the 1200 block of Gordon Lane. The subject was riding a bike and had a light attached to his head.

I responded to a burglar alarm in the 1300 block of McClaren Drive. The home was secure in the front, but the gates were locked and there was a dog in the back yard, so I was unable to check the rear of the house.

I checked the parks and river access points. All appeared to be clear of any problems.

Monday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Sept. 23

I patrolled the neighborhood and completed all 32 scheduled vacation watch checks. All homes were secure.

It was a very warm day and traffic was heavy in the morning.

A member sent an email regarding a vehicle burglary that had occurred two weeks ago in the 4100 block of Ashton Drive. The member made an online report.

All parks and river access points checked clear for any problems.

I responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle making several passes by Rio Americano High School and "flipping off" school security personnel. The driver was a former student who drives a white sedan. He is known to law enforcement and has been served a trespass notice by the school administrators in the past. The area checked clear.

I was waved down by a mailman who reported seeing a suspicious person on a bike enter a backyard in the 700 block of Whitehall Way. I checked the home, which had an open gate. The back of the home checked clear and all doors were secure.

- CALL 911 from a land line.
- Or, if calling from a cell phone within Sacramento County, call (916) 874-5111.

TO REPORT A CRIME

There are two ways to report a crime to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department:

1. Call the Sheriff's Department NON-EMERGENCY LINE at (916) 874-5115. To bypass the recorded messaging when you call, dial 0 after the line is answered.
